FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. ARTURO PEREZ (Applicant) has filed an application for a credential to practice as a substance abuse counselor-in-training in Wisconsin.
- 2. Information received in the application process reflects the following convictions:

7/20/90 – Battery; Criminal Damage to Property
12/10/93 – Second Degree Intentional Homicide with a Deadly Weapon; Repeat Offender

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. §440.88.
- 2. The facts and circumstances of the past convictions are substantially related to your request for certification as a substance abuse counselor-in-training.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that ARTURO PEREZ is GRANTED A SUBSTANCE ABUSE COUNSELOR-IN-TRAINING CREDENTIAL subject to the following LIMITATIONS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

Practice Limitations

- 1. Applicant shall provide a copy of this Order to all prospective employers.
- 2. Applicant shall comply with all terms and conditions of parole imposed upon him.
- 3. Applicant shall commit no new violations of law, and shall report all law enforcement contacts leading to arrest, charge or conviction to the Department Monitor within 48 hours of any such event.

Reporting Requirements

- 4. It is Applicant's responsibility to arrange for his supervisor(s) to provide work reports to the Department Monitor on a quarterly basis, as directed by Department Monitor. These reports shall describe the Applicant's activities and verify that he is in compliance with the laws governing the practice of a substance abuse counselor-in-training and the terms of this Order.
- 5. Applicant shall file with the Department quarterly reports at the direction of the Department Monitor commencing ninety (90) days after Applicant commences employment. Each report shall include the following:
 - a. The name, address and telephone number of Applicant, and name, address and telephone number of Applicant's employer;
 - b. A statement from the Applicant as to whether he has had any law enforcement contacts leading to arrest, charge or conviction (including DWI/OWI) during the term of the Order;
 - c. Applicant shall report to the Department Monitor any change of employment status, residence, address or telephone number within five (5) days of the date of a change.
- 6. Applicant shall make arrangements for the submission of quarterly reports from his parole agent outlining Applicant's status and participation in parole, and shall further arrange to have his parole agent notify the Department Monitor immediately of any violation of parole

- terms. Applicant shall provide the Department with current releases complying with state and federal laws, authorizing release and access to his parole records.
- 7. Applicant is responsible for compliance with all of the terms and conditions of this Order, including the timely submission of reports by others. Applicant shall promptly notify Department Monitor of any suspected violations of any of the terms and conditions of this Order by Applicant.

DEPARTMENT MONITOR

8. The Department Monitor is the individual designated by the department as its agent to coordinate compliance with the terms of this Order. Any requests, petitions, reports or other information required by this Order shall be mailed, faxed or delivered to:

Petitions for Modification

9. Applicant may petition the Department Monitor for modification of the terms of this Order after completion of parole and completion of one year of practice in compliance with all terms and conditions of this Order. Applicant's petition must include Applicant's history of employment from the effective date of this Order that states the dates and names of any employer, such employment in total equaling one year of practice. Any such petition shall be accompanied by a written recommendation from Applicant's current employer that includes, among other things, the dates of employment and scope of responsibility during such employment. A denial of such a petition for modification shall not be deemed a denial of credential under Wis. Stats. § 227.01(3), Wis. Admin. Code ch. SPS 1, and shall not be subject to any right to further hearing or appeal.

Costs

10. Applicant shall be responsible for all costs and expenses associated with compliance with the terms of this Order.

Summary Suspension/Additional Discipline

11. Violation of any of the terms of this Order may be construed as conduct imperiling public health, safety and welfare and may result in a summary suspension of Applicant's credential. The Department, in its discretion, may in the alternative impose additional conditions and limitations or other additional discipline for a violation of any of the terms of this Order. In the event that Applicant fails to submit quarterly reports as ordered, Applicant's credential may, in the discretion of the Department or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Applicant has complied with the terms of this Order.
