On December 11, 2013, the Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board ("Board") issued a Final Decision and Order ("Order") suspending Respondent's pharmacy license for an indefinite period. Respondent has been granted a stay of suspension and his license is currently limited with certain terms and conditions.

On February 11, 2015, the Board considered Respondent's request for a reduction in the frequency of drug and alcohol screens, reduction of AA/NA frequency and removal of the practice limitations specified in provisions C20, C21, C22 and C23 of the Order. Based upon the information of record, the Board finds and makes the following:

ORDER

1. Respondent's request for a reduction in the frequency of drug and alcohol screens is hereby GRANTED. Respondent's frequency is reduced to 36 per year and one annual hair test.
2. Respondent's request for reduction in the frequency of AA/NA meeting attendance and removal of limitations C20, C21, C22 and C23 is hereby DENIED. The Board requires further compliance under the current terms of the Order before additional modifications will be approved.
3. All other terms and conditions of the Order not otherwise modified remain in full force and effect.
4. This order is effective the date of its signing.
