The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Pharmacy Examining Board (Board). The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent Monica M. Zatarski, DOB January 4, 1980, is licensed in the state of Wisconsin to practice pharmacy, having license no. 14149-40, first issued on July 1, 2004, and current through May 31, 2016. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Department is N100W14371 Sunburst Trail, Germantown, WI 53022.

2. At all times relevant to this proceeding, Respondent was employed as a pharmacist at MD Custom Rx, located in Brookfield, Wisconsin.

3. On June 18, 2014, and again on June 24, 2014, Respondent gave a physician information about therapeutic values or uses of medication.

4. Respondent's advised treatment plans were written on forms that included the MDCustom RX logo. The form headings were captioned, "Pharmacist Recommended Treatment Plan".

5. Respondent furnished physicians with the "Pharmacist Recommended Treatment Plan" forms. The documents were used as prescription order blanks for new prescriptions, were imprinted with the MDCustom RX logo, and included the following direction:

[Patient's Testosterone level measured below that considered optimal (ie -140pg/mL).

SUGGEST: Starting a prescription for compounded Testosterone +Chrysin (to help prevent aromatization)...Please note prescriptions for controlled substances must be written out. Please write out prescription for testosterone in the space below:

6. At the bottom of the imprinted prescription order blanks was a line designated for the physician's signature and another for the date.

7. In resolution of this matter, Respondent Monica M. Zatarski, R.Ph., consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 450.10(1), and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. Respondent Monica Zatarski, R.Ph.'s conduct in furnishing a prescriber with a prescription order blank imprinted with the name of the specific pharmacy for purposes other than refills of existing orders constituted unprofessional conduct as defined by Wis. Admin. Code § Phar 10.03(15).

3. As a result of the above violations, Respondent Monica M. Zatarski, R.Ph., is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 450.10(1)(b)1.

ORDER

1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.

2. Respondent Monica M. Zatarski, R.Ph., is REPRIMANDED.

3. The license to practice pharmacy issued to Monica M. Zatarski, R.Ph., (license number 14149-40) is LIMITED as follows:

a. Respondent shall not furnish prescribers with prescription order form blanks that identify the particular pharmacy or pharmacist.

b. This limitation is permanent.

4. Within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, Monica Zatarski, R.Ph., shall pay COSTS of this matter in the amount of \$231.50.

5. Payment of costs (made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services) shall be sent by Respondent to the Department Monitor at the address below:



6. Violation of any of the terms of this Order may be construed as conduct imperiling public health, safety and welfare and may result in a summary suspension of Respondent's license. The Board in its discretion may in the alternative impose additional conditions and limitations or other additional discipline for a violation of any of the terms of this Order. In the event Respondent fails to timely submit payment of costs as ordered, Respondent's license (no. 14149-40) may, in the discretion of the Board or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with payment of costs.

7. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.

STIPULATION

Division of Legal Services and Compliance Case No. 14 PHM 075

Respondent Monica M. Zatarski, R.Ph., and the Division of Legal Services and Compliance, Department of Safety and Professional Services stipulate as follows:

1. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation by the Division of Legal Services and Compliance. Respondent consents to the resolution of this investigation by Stipulation.

2. Respondent understands that by signing this Stipulation, Respondent voluntarily and knowingly waives the following rights:

- the right to a hearing on the allegations against Respondent, at which time the State has the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
- the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against Respondent;
- the right to call witnesses on Respondent's behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena;
- the right to testify on Respondent's own behalf;
- the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision;
- the right to petition for rehearing; and
- all other applicable rights afforded to Respondent under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code, and other provisions of state or federal law.

3. Respondent is aware of Respondent's right to seek legal representation and has been provided an opportunity to obtain legal counsel before signing this Stipulation.

4. Respondent agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board (Board). The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Respondent waives all rights to any appeal of the Board's order, if adopted in the form as attached.


5. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall then be returned to the Division

of Legal Services and Compliance for further proceedings. In the event that the Stipulation is not accepted by the Board, the parties agree not to contend that the Board has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.


6. The parties to this Stipulation agree that the attorney or other agent for the Division of Legal Services and Compliance and any member of the Board ever assigned as an advisor in this investigation may appear before the Board in open or closed session, without the presence of Respondent or Respondent's attorney, for purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that any member of the Board may have in connection with deliberations on the Stipulation. Additionally, any such advisor may vote on whether the Board should accept this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.

7. Respondent is informed that should the Board adopt this Stipulation, the Board's Final Decision and Order is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard Department procedure.

8. The Division of Legal Services and Compliance joins Respondent in recommending the Board adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
