The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Real Estate Appraisers Board (Board). The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

## FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent Jeffrey D. White (dob April 18, 1957) is certified in the State of Wisconsin as a Certified General Appraiser, having certificate of licensure and certification number 324-10, first issued on November 24, 1992 and current through December 14, 2015. Jeffrey D. White's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department) is 6731 Lowes Creek Court, Eau Claire, Wisconsin 54701.

2. On July 6, 2009, Respondent performed an appraisal of property located at May Coulee Road, Northfield, Wisconsin 54635.

3. On or about December 2, 2013, the Department received a complaint alleging that the subject appraisal violated the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice (USPAP). Division of Legal Services and Compliance Case Number 13 APP 102 was subsequently opened for investigation.

4. Respondent's appraisal was reviewed by the Division of Legal Services and Compliance and it was determined that the appraisal and appraisal report violated USPAP Rules and/or Standards Rules (SR) as follows:

a. Respondent failed to retain his work file for five years after its preparation. [Record Keeping Section of the Ethics Rule.]

b. Respondent valued multiple parcels, one with water frontage and one vacant land, by adding the values of the various component parts and failed to analyze the effect on value of the assemblage. [SR 1-4(e).]

c. Respondent failed to identify that he utilized a hypothetical vacant waterfront lot in the Sales Comparison Approach. [SR 1-2(g), SR 2-2(b)(x).]

d. Respondent's signed certification was not similar in content to the form provided in USPAP. [SR 2-3.]

5. In resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

## CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Real Estate Appraisers Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 458.26, and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Jeffrey D. White violated the Record Keeping Section of the USPAP Ethics Rule by failing to retain his workfile for a period of at least five years after preparation.

3. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Jeffrey D. White violated USPAP SR 1-2(g) by failing to identify a hypothetical condition necessary in an assignment.

4. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Jeffrey D. White violated USPAP SR 1-4(e) by, when analyzing the assemblage of various component parts of a property, failing to analyze the effect on value, if any, of the assemblage and by valuing the whole solely by adding together the individual values of the component parts.

5. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Jeffrey D. White violated USPAP SR 2-2(b)(x) by failing to clearly and conspicuously state all hypothetical conditions and state that their use might have affected the assignment results.

6. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Jeffrey D. White violated USPAP SR 2-3 by failing to include in his appraisal report a signed certification that is similar in content to the form provided in USPAP.

7. As a result of the above violations, Jeffrey D. White has violated Wis. Admin. Code § RL (now SPS) 86.01(1) and (2), and is therefore subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 458.26(3)(b), (c) and (i).

#### <u>ORDER</u>

1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.

2. Respondent Jeffrey D. White is REPRIMANDED.

3. The Certified General Appraiser certificate of licensure and certification issued to Jeffrey D. White (number 324-10) is LIMITED as follows:

a. Within 90 days from the date of this Order, Respondent shall successfully complete 22 hours of education consisting of the following courses offered by a provider pre-approved by the Board's monitoring liaison, including taking and passing any exam offered for the courses:

- i. Subdivision Valuation: A Comprehensive Guide to Valuing Improved Subdivisions (7 hours), and
- ii. USPAP (15 hours).

b. The courses listed above may be taken in person in a classroom setting or online.

c. Respondent shall submit proof of successful completion of the ordered education in the form of verification from the institution providing the education to the Department Monitor at the address stated below. None of the education completed pursuant to this requirement may be used to satisfy any continuing education requirements that have been or may be instituted by the Board or the Department, and also may not be used in future attempts to upgrade a credential in Wisconsin.

d. This limitation shall be removed from Respondent's certificate of licensure and certification after satisfying the Board or its designee that Respondent has successfully completed all of the ordered education.

4. Within 90 days from the date of this Order, Jeffrey D. White shall pay COSTS of this matter in the amount of \$600.

5. Proof of successful course completion and payment of costs (made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services) shall be sent by Respondent to the Department Monitor at the address below:

6. Violation of any of the terms of this Order may be construed as conduct imperiling public health, safety and welfare and may result in a summary suspension of Respondent's certificate of licensure and certification. The Board in its discretion may in the alternative impose additional conditions and limitations or other additional discipline for a violation of any of the terms of this Order. In the event Respondent fails to timely submit payment of the costs as ordered or fails to comply with the ordered education as set forth above, Respondent's certificate of licensure and certification (no. 324-10) may, in the discretion of the Board or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with payment of the costs and completion of the education.

7. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.

Respondent Jeffrey D. White and the Division of Legal Services and Compliance, Department of Safety and Professional Services stipulate as follows:

1. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation by the Division of Legal Services and Compliance. Respondent consents to the resolution of this investigation by Stipulation.

2. Respondent understands that by signing this Stipulation, Respondent voluntarily and knowingly waives the following rights:

- the right to a hearing on the allegations against Respondent, at which time the State has the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
- the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against Respondent;
- the right to call witnesses on Respondent's behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena;
- the right to testify on Respondent's own behalf;
- the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision;
- the right to petition for rehearing; and
- all other applicable rights afforded to Respondent under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code, and other provisions of state or federal law.

3. Respondent is aware of Respondent's right to seek legal representation and has been provided an opportunity to obtain legal counsel before signing this Stipulation.

4. Respondent agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Wisconsin Real Estate Appraisers Board (Board). The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Respondent waives all rights to any appeal of the Board's order, if adopted in the form as attached.

5. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall then be returned to the Division

of Legal Services and Compliance for further proceedings. In the event that the Stipulation is not accepted by the Board, the parties agree not to contend that the Board has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.

6. The parties to this Stipulation agree that the attorney or other agent for the Division of Legal Services and Compliance and any member of the Board ever assigned as an advisor in this investigation may appear before the Board in open or closed session, without the presence of Respondent, for purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that any member of the Board may have in connection with deliberations on the Stipulation. Additionally, any such advisor may vote on whether the Board should accept this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.

7. Respondent is informed that should the Board adopt this Stipulation, the Board's Final Decision and Order is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard Department procedure.

8. The Division of Legal Services and Compliance joins Respondent in recommending the Board adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
