On July 13, 2013, the Wisconsin Medical Examining ("Board") issued a Final Decision and Order ("Order") suspending Respondent's license to practice as a physician assistant for an indefinite period. Respondent has been granted a stay of suspension and her license is currently limited with certain terms and conditions.

Based upon the information of record, which demonstrates that Respondent is eligible for a temporary reduction at this time, the following is entered:

ORDER

1. Respondent's request for a reduction in drug and alcohol screens is hereby GRANTED. Respondent's frequency is reduced to 14 urine screens per year and one annual hair test until she obtains employment as a physician assistant, at which time the frequency will be increased to 36 screens per year plus one annual hair test.

2. All other terms and conditions of the Order not otherwise modified remain in full force and effect.

3. This order is effective the date of its signing.
