On December 10, 2015, the Wisconsin Board of Nursing ("Board") issued a Final Decision and Order ("Order") limiting Respondent's practical nursing license with certain terms and conditions including, but not limited to, completion of a fitness for duty assessment. The Order further states that Respondent's license shall be limited in a manner to address any concerns of the Board and any recommendations resulting from the assessment.

On May 12, 2016, the Board reviewed and accepted the written report resulting from Respondent's assessment. Based on the assessor's recommendations, the following is entered:

ORDER

1. Within 30 days from the date of this order, Respondent shall begin and continue treatment with a preapproved psychiatrist for medication management, and shall begin and continue cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT) with a preapproved psychotherapist.

a. Respondent shall comply with all recommendations of the psychiatrist and psychotherapist, including frequency of sessions, and shall not discontinue any treatment without written support from the respective provider and approval from the Board or its designee.


b. Respondent shall ensure that the psychiatrist and the psychotherapist submit quarterly reports to the Department Monitor regarding treatment progress and concerns.

2. Respondent shall undergo a fitness for duty assessment with a preapproved evaluator no sooner than one month prior to petitioning for full licensure. A report with the assessment results shall be submitted to the Department Monitor within 15 days of completion.

3. All other terms and conditions of the Order remain in full force and effect.

4. This order is effective the date of its signing.
