The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Wisconsin Board of Nursing (Board). The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Licensee Melonie S. Driese, R.N., (dob March 18, 1981) is licensed in the State of Wisconsin as a professional nurse, having license number 222805-30, first issued on June 3, 2015 and current through February 28, 2018. Licensee's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department) is E10214 State Road 82, La Farge, Wisconsin 54639.

2. At all times relevant to this proceeding, Licensee was employed as a professional nurse at a nursing home through an agency, located in Pewaukee, Wisconsin.

3. Patient A has an order for insulin 12 units of NovoLog® insulin as well as additional insulin based on a sliding scale.

4. During the evening medication pass, Licensee tested Patient A's blood sugar which was at 252. Based on the sliding scale, Licensee determined that she would administer 4 units of insulin based on the sliding scale in addition to the 12 units of NovoLog®.
5. Licensee reviewed Patient A's medication administration record (MAR), thought she saw that the standing order was for 100 units of insulin and drew up 104 units.
6. Licensee administered the 104 units of insulin to Patient A with his meal.
7. As Licensee was reading Patient B's MAR, she noticed Patient B had the same insulin order (100 units) and read the dosing amount. Licensee immediately realized that she had misread Patient A's MAR and administered too much insulin to Patient A.
8. Licensee immediately notified her supervisor.
9. Patient A was transferred to a hospital and admitted overnight, as a precaution, in case his blood sugar was to drop rapidly.
10. Patient A did not suffer any adverse effects from this incident.
11. Since this incident, Licensee double checks all medications with the MAR and the five (5) rights for medication administration before administering them to patients. The nursing home has also changed how insulin orders on the MAR read by making them red with a "warning" to double check dose.
12. In resolution of this matter, Licensee consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Board of Nursing is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

ORDER

1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.
2. Within six (6) months of the date of this Order, Melonie S. Driese, R.N., shall at her own expense take and successfully complete four (4) hours of education on the topic of medication errors and three (3) hours of education on the topic of diabetes as follows:
 - a. Each course attended in satisfaction of this Order must be pre-approved by the Board or its designee. Licensee shall be responsible for locating course(s) satisfactory to the Board and for obtaining the required approval of the courses from the Board or its designee. Licensee must take and pass any exam offered for the course(s).


b. Licensee shall submit proof of successful completion of the education in the form of verification from the institution providing the education to the Department Monitor at the address stated below. None of the education completed pursuant to this requirement may be used to satisfy any education requirements that have been or may be instituted by the Board or Department.

STIPULATION

Licensee Melonie S. Driese, R.N., and the Division of Legal Services and Compliance, Department of Safety and Professional Services stipulate as follows:

1. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation by the Division of Legal Services and Compliance. Licensee consents to the resolution of this investigation by Stipulation.

2. Licensee understands that by signing this Stipulation, Licensee voluntarily and knowingly waives the following rights:

- the right to a hearing on the allegations against Licensee, at which time the State has the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
- the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against Licensee;
- the right to call witnesses on Licensee's behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena;
- the right to testify on Licensee's own behalf;
- the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision;
- the right to petition for rehearing; and
- all other applicable rights afforded to Licensee under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code, and other provisions of state or federal law.

3. Licensee is aware of Licensee's right to seek legal representation and has been provided an opportunity to obtain legal counsel before signing this Stipulation.

4. Licensee agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Wisconsin Board of Nursing (Board). The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Licensee waives all rights to any appeal of the Board's order, if adopted in the form as attached.

5. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall then be returned to the Division

of Legal Services and Compliance for further proceedings. In the event that the Stipulation is not accepted by the Board, the parties agree not to contend that the Board has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.

6. The parties to this Stipulation agree that the attorney or other agent for the Division of Legal Services and Compliance and any member of the Board ever assigned as an advisor in this investigation may appear before the Board in open or closed session, without the presence of Licensee, for purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that any member of the Board may have in connection with deliberations on the Stipulation. Additionally, any such advisor may vote on whether the Board should accept this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.

7. Licensee is informed that should the Board adopt this Stipulation, the Board's Final Decision and Order is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard Department procedure.

8. The Division of Legal Services and Compliance joins Licensee in recommending the Board adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
