FINDINGS OF FACT

1. JAMIE MARTIN (Applicant) has filed an application (# 603387) for a credential to practice as a private security person in Wisconsin.
2. Information received in the application process reflects that the Applicant has a history that includes the following convictions and violation:
 - A. On or about September 11, 1998 – Battery, a misdemeanor.
 - B. On or about September 11, 1998 – Disorderly Conduct-Domestic Violence, a misdemeanor.
 - C. On or about September 11, 1998 – Battery-Domestic Violence, a misdemeanor.
 - D. On or about September 11, 1998 – Bail Jumping, a misdemeanor.
 - E. On or about March 17, 2004 – Theft, an ordinance violation.
 - F. On or about May 1, 2004 – Operating While Intoxicated, an ordinance violation.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services has jurisdiction over this matter, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.26.

2. The facts and circumstances of the convictions and violation referenced above substantially relate to the practice of a private security person. Applicant by his conduct is subject to action against his license, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.26.
3. Applicant has been convicted of a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence and therefore he is permanently prohibited from possessing a firearm, per 18 U.S.C. § 922(g)(9).

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that JAMIE MARTIN is GRANTED a PRIVATE SECURITY PERMIT subject to the following LIMITATIONS, TERMS, AND CONDITIONS:

Practice Limitations

1. Applicant shall show a copy of this Order to his current and any future employer. Applicant shall provide the Department of Safety and Professional Services Monitor (Department Monitor) with written acknowledgement from each employer that a copy of this Order has been received. Such acknowledgement shall be provided to the Department Monitor within fourteen (14) days of beginning new employment and/or within fourteen (14) days of the date of this Order for employment current as of the date of this Order.

Reporting Requirements

2. It is Applicant's responsibility to arrange for his security guard supervisor(s) to provide work reports to the Department Monitor on a quarterly basis, beginning 90 days from the date of this Order. These reports shall describe the Applicant's activities and verify that he is in compliance with the laws governing the practice of a private security person and the terms of this Order.
3. Applicant shall report to the Department any change of employment status, residence, address or telephone number within five (5) days of the date of a change. In addition, Applicant shall report any arrest or conviction within 48 hours of the arrest or entry of conviction.
4. Applicant is responsible for compliance with all of the terms and conditions of this Order, including the timely submission of reports by others. Applicant shall promptly notify the Department Monitor of any suspected violations of any of the terms and conditions of this Order by Applicant.

Department Monitor

5. The Department Monitor is the individual designated by the department as its agent to coordinate compliance with the terms of this Order. Any requests, petitions, reports or other information required by this Order shall be mailed, faxed or delivered to:

Firearms Ban

6. Applicant shall not apply for a Firearms Permit with the Department.
7. Applicant shall not apply for employment in any position that might require or allow him to work in an armed capacity.
8. The firearms ban may not be modified at any time.

Petitions for Modification

9. Applicant may petition the Department for modification of the terms of this Order after completion of one year of practice in compliance with all terms and conditions of this Order. The firearms ban is permanent and may not be modified while the limited license is in effect or at any time thereafter. Applicant's petition must include his history of employment from the effective date of this Order that states the dates and names of any employer, such employment in total equaling one year of practice. Any such petition shall be accompanied by a written recommendation from Applicant's current employer that includes, among other things, the dates of employment and scope of responsibility during such employment, and, if applicable, his treatment provider expressly supporting the specific modifications sought. A denial of such a petition for modification shall not be deemed a denial of license under Wis. Stats. §§ 227.01(3), or 227.42, or Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 1, and shall not be subject to any right to further hearing or appeal.


Costs

10. Applicant shall be responsible for all costs and expenses associated with compliance with the terms of this Order.

Suspension

11. In the event that Applicant violates any term of this Order, Applicant's license may, in the discretion of the Department or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Applicant has complied with the terms of the Order. The Department may, in addition and/or in the alternative, refer any violation of this Order to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further investigation and action.
