NOTICE OF SUSPENSION

You are hereby notified that your Dwelling Contractor and Dwelling Contractor Qualifier credentials are suspended indefinitely, beginning September 5, 2017.


The basis for this suspension is a violation of the terms of your reissued license under Department Order 0004871.

You signed a contract on September 28, 2015. You were hired, by the Complainant, to add a two story deck to Complainant's dwelling. At that time, you were paid \$3,000.00 by Complainant as a down payment. You pulled a permit for the job on October 14, 2015. Since that date, you have performed no work at the site and have demonstrated no intention to finish performance on the contract. Additionally, you have not returned the down payment to the Complainant.

For the above conduct, your Dwelling Contractor and Dwelling Contractor Qualifier credentials were suspended for one week. After you reobtained your credentials, you were required to repay Complainant Ashleigh Meinholz (Madison College Rental) \$3,000.00 within one month. Over eleven months have passed, and no payment has been made, nor an adequate explanation offered up for why the prior order was not complied with.

After you have repaid Complainant, you may request, in writing, to have your credentials reinstated. The reinstatement process is set forth in Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 305.10(1)(f).
