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Please read this agreement prior to viewing the Decision:

In addition, many but not all orders for the time period between 1977 and November, 1998 are posted. Not all orders issued by a credentialing authority constitute a formal disciplinary action.
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- There may be discrepancies between the online copies and the original document. Original documents should be consulted as the definitive representation of the order's content. Copies of original orders may be obtained by mailing requests to the Department of Safety and Professional Services, PO Box 8935, Madison, WI 53708-8935. The Department charges copying fees. *All requests must cite the case number, the date of the order, and respondent's name* as it appears on the order.
- Reported decisions may have an appeal pending, and discipline may be stayed during the appeal. Information about the current status of a credential issued by the Department of Safety and Professional Services is shown on the Department's Web Site under "License Lookup."


You are hereby notified that your Journeyman Electrician License is suspended for one week, beginning November 6, 2017.

The basis for this suspension is the work you performed at 4105 South Kirkwood Avenue, St. Francis, Wisconsin 53235, on January 16, 2017. Per City of St. Francis municipal code § 237-6(1), you are required to obtain a permit via a master electrician prior to commencing work. The City of St. Francis Building Inspector, Craig Vretenar, confirmed that you neither had a master electrician pull the requisite permit, nor were you supervised by a master electrician during the work you performed.

The above conduct constitutes a violation of Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 305.40(4)(a)1. This violation is a basis for discipline pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code ch. SPS 305.

After the one week suspension, you may request, in writing, to have your credential reinstated. The reinstatement process is set forth in Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 305.10(1)(f). You have the right to request a hearing on the suspension by sending a request for hearing to the Department of Safety and Professional Services, Chief Legal Counsel, PO Box 8935, Madison, Wisconsin 53708-8935, which must be received by the Department no later than 30 days from the date of mailing of this Notice. The date of mailing of this Notice is October 13, 2017. Any hearing on the suspension will be held in accordance with the requirements set forth in Wis. Stat. ch. 227.
