The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Wisconsin Board of Nursing (Board). The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent Matthew D. Heather, R.N., (dob September 7, 1977) is licensed in the State of Wisconsin as a professional nurse, having license number 219645-30, first issued on October 8, 2014, and current through February 28, 2018. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department) is 1642 Utah Street, Sturgeon Bay, Wisconsin 54235.

2. On February 20, 2017, Respondent was convicted of operating a motor vehicle while under the influence (OWI 3rd), a misdemeanor, in violation of Wis. Stat. § 346.63(1)(a), in Door County Circuit Court case number 2015CT0061. The circumstances of the OWI were determined to not be related to the practice of nursing.

3. On February 20, 2017, Respondent self-reported the conviction to the Department within 48 hours of the date of conviction, as required by Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 4.09(2).

4. A CCAP search revealed Respondent was also convicted of the following:

a. On November 13, 1997, two (2) counts of battery, a misdemeanor, in violation of Wis. Stat. § 940.19(1); one (1) count of criminal trespass to dwelling, a misdemeanor, in violation of Wis. Stat. § 943.14; and one (1) count of resisting or obstructing an officer, a misdemeanor, in violation of Wis. Stat. § 946.41(1), in Door County Circuit Court case number 1997CF0082.

b. On December 6, 2005, one (1) count of operating while under the influence (OWI 2nd), a misdemeanor, in violation of Wis. Stat. § 346.63(1)(a), in Walworth County Circuit Court case number 2005CT00683.

5. When Respondent submitted an application for nursing licensure in Wisconsin on July 9, 2014, Respondent failed to disclose any prior misdemeanors or convictions on his application (ID#510177).

6. On the application, question #8 reads: “Do you have any felony or misdemeanor charges pending against you or have you ever been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor?” Respondent answered “No.”

7. On April 4, 2017, during the Department’s investigation of the circumstances of the OWI 3rd, Respondent acknowledged he made an error in his application to the Department in order to obtain a nursing license.

8. The circumstances surrounding the 1997, 2005 and 2017 convictions were determined to not be substantially related to the practice of nursing.

9. In resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Board of Nursing has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07, and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Matthew D. Heather, R.N., violated Wis. Stat. § 441.07(1g)(a), by fraud in the procuring of the certificate or license.

3. As a result of the above conduct, Matthew D. Heather, R.N., is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07(1g)(b) and (d).

ORDER

1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.
2. Respondent Matthew D. Heather, R.N., is REPRIMANDED.
3. The professional nursing license issued to Matthew D. Heather, R.N. (license number 219645-30) to practice nursing in the State of Wisconsin, and his privilege to practice in Wisconsin pursuant to the Nurse Licensure Compact, are LIMITED as follows:
 - a. Within sixty (60) days from the date of this Order, Respondent shall, at his own expense, undergo an AODA assessment with an evaluator pre-approved by the Board or its designee who has experience conducting these assessments.
 - b. Prior to the assessment, Respondent shall provide a copy of this Order to the evaluator. Respondent shall provide the Department Monitor with written acknowledgment from the evaluator that a copy of this Order has been received by the evaluator. Such acknowledgment shall be provided to the Department Monitor prior to the assessment.
 - c. Respondent shall provide and keep on file with the evaluator current releases complying with state and federal laws. The releases shall allow the Board, its designee, and any employee of the Department to obtain a copy of the assessment. Copies of these releases shall immediately be filed with the Department Monitor.
 - d. Respondent shall identify and provide the evaluator with authorizations to communicate with all physicians, mental health professionals, and facilities at which Respondent has been treated or evaluated.
 - e. The Board, or its designee, may impose additional limitations upon Respondent's license based on the results of the assessment and/or the evaluator's recommendations.
 - f. Respondent shall comply with the evaluator's recommendations.
4. The professional nursing license issued to Matthew D. Heather, R.N., (license number 219645-30) and his privilege to practice in Wisconsin pursuant to the Nurse Licensure Compact, are further LIMITED as follows:
 - a. Within ninety (90) days of the date of this Order, Respondent shall at his own expense, successfully complete three (3) hours of education on the topic of ethics and professionalism and two (2) hours on nurse practice acts offered by a provider pre-approved by the Board's monitoring liaison, including taking and passing any exam offered for the courses.

- b. Respondent shall submit proof of successful completion of the education in the form of verification from the institution providing the education to the Department Monitor at the address stated below. None of the education completed pursuant to this requirement may be used to satisfy any continuing education requirements that have been or may be instituted by the Board or Department, and also may not be used in future attempts to upgrade a credential in Wisconsin.

5. Pursuant to Uniform Nurse Licensure Compact regulations, Respondent's nursing practice is limited to Wisconsin during the pendency of these limitations. This requirement may be waived only upon the prior written authorization of both the Wisconsin Board of Nursing and the regulatory board in the state in which Respondent proposes to practice.

6. Within 120 days from the date of this Order, Matthew D. Heather, R.N., shall pay COSTS of this matter in the amount of \$542.00.

7. Request for approval of an evaluator, courses, proof of successful course completion and payment of costs (made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services) shall be sent by Respondent to the Department Monitor at the address below:

8. In the event Respondent violates any term of this Order, Respondent's license (219645-30), or Respondent's right to renew his license, may, in the discretion of the Board or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with the terms of the Order. The Board may, in addition and/or in the alternative refer any violation of this Order to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further investigation and action.

9. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.

STIPULATION

Respondent Matthew D. Heather, R.N., and the Division of Legal Services and Compliance, Department of Safety and Professional Services stipulate as follows:

1. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation by the Division of Legal Services and Compliance. Respondent consents to the resolution of this investigation by Stipulation.

2. Respondent understands that by signing this Stipulation, Respondent voluntarily and knowingly waives the following rights:

- the right to a hearing on the allegations against Respondent, at which time the State has the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
- the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against Respondent;
- the right to call witnesses on Respondent's behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena;
- the right to testify on Respondent's own behalf;
- the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision;
- the right to petition for rehearing; and
- all other applicable rights afforded to Respondent under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code, and other provisions of state or federal law.

3. Respondent is aware of Respondent's right to seek legal representation and has been provided an opportunity to obtain legal counsel before signing this Stipulation.

4. Respondent agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Wisconsin Board of Nursing (Board). The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Respondent waives all rights to any appeal of the Board's order, if adopted in the form as attached.


5. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall then be returned to the Division


of Legal Services and Compliance for further proceedings. In the event that the Stipulation is not accepted by the Board, the parties agree not to contend that the Board has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.


6. The parties to this Stipulation agree that the attorney or other agent for the Division of Legal Services and Compliance and any member of the Board ever assigned as an advisor in this investigation may appear before the Board in open or closed session, without the presence of Respondent, for purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that any member of the Board may have in connection with deliberations on the Stipulation. Additionally, any such advisor may vote on whether the Board should accept this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.


7. Respondent is informed that should the Board adopt this Stipulation, the Board's Final Decision and Order is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard Department procedure.
