On September 13, 2012, the Wisconsin Board of Nursing ("Board") issued a Final Decision and Order ("Order") suspending Respondent's professional nursing license for an indefinite period. Respondent has been granted a stay of suspension and her license is currently limited with certain terms and conditions.

On December 13, 2018, the Board considered Respondent's request for full licensure or a reduction in the frequency of drug and alcohol screens, termination of direct supervision and reduction in the frequency of AA/NA meetings. Based upon the information of record, the Board finds and makes the following:

ORDER

1. Respondent's request for full licensure is DENIED. Respondent needs to practice nursing under the conditions of the modified Board Order before the Board will consider granting full licensure.
2. Respondent's request for a reduction in the frequency of drug and alcohol screens is GRANTED. Respondent's frequency is reduced to not less than fourteen (14) urine screens per year and one (1) annual hair test.
3. Respondent's request for termination of direct supervision is GRANTED.
4. Respondent's request for a reduction in the frequency of AA/NA meetings to once every two (2) weeks is GRANTED.
4. All other terms and conditions of the Order not otherwise modified remain in full force and effect.

5. This order is effective the date of its signing.
