On December 19, 2013 the Wisconsin Board of Nursing ("Board") issued a Final Decision and Order ("December 2013 Order") limiting Respondent's professional nursing license with certain terms and conditions. Respondent's license was subsequently suspended on April 6, 2015 for violation of the December 2013 Order.

On November 2, 2015, the Board issued an Order Denying Reinstatement and Imposing Limitations ("November 2015 Order"), in which Respondent was required to demonstrate at least six (6) months of compliance with all limitations before petitioning for a stay of suspension.

Respondent recently petitioned for a stay of suspension and a temporary reduction in drug and alcohol screens. The petition was reviewed by the Board designee and, based upon the information of record, the following is entered:

ORDER

1. The suspension of Respondent's professional nursing license (#164928-30) is hereby STAYED. The stay is continuous, contingent upon Respondent's compliance with the terms and conditions of the November 2015 Order.

2. Respondent's request for a reduction in drug and alcohol screens is hereby GRANTED. Respondent's frequency is reduced to not less than 14 urine screens per year and one annual hair test until she obtains employment as a nurse, at which time the frequency will be increased to not less than 48 screens per year.

3. All other terms and conditions of the November 2015 Order not otherwise modified remain in full force and effect.

4. This order is effective the date of its signing.
