On October 19, 2016, the Wisconsin Board of Nursing ("Board") issued a Final Decision and Order ("Order") suspending Applicant's professional nursing license for an indefinite period. Applicant has been granted a stay of suspension and her license is currently limited with certain terms and conditions.

On March 8, 2018, the Board considered Applicant's request for a reduction in drug screens, termination of AODA therapy, termination of restricted setting in home health care and assisted living and access to controlled substances. Based upon the information of record, the Board finds and makes the following:

ORDER

1. Applicant's request for a reduction in drug screens is hereby GRANTED. Applicant's frequency is reduced to not less than 14 urine screens per year and one annual hair test until she obtains employment as a professional nurse, at which time the frequency will be increased to not less than 36 screens per year.

2. Applicant's request for access to controlled substances and the ability to work in home health and assisted living settings is hereby DENIED. The Applicant has insufficient time under the Board order (10/19/16) to demonstrate adequate compliance.

3. The Board determined the Applicant's AODA treater needs to determine if his/her recommendation is to have AODA therapy terminated or the sessions reduced.

4. All other terms and conditions of the Order not otherwise modified remain in full force and effect.

5. This order is effective the date of its signing.
