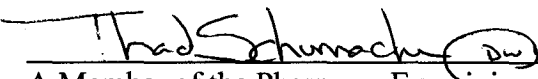
On January 3, 2017, the Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board ("Board") issued an Order Granting Limited License ("Order") suspending Applicant's Pharmacist license for an indefinite period. Respondent has been granted a stay of suspension and his license is currently limited with certain terms and conditions.

On May 24, 2018, the Board considered Applicant's request for unsupervised practice and a reduction in the frequency of drug and alcohol screens. Based upon the information of record, the Board finds and makes the following:

ORDER

1. Applicant's request for unsupervised practice is hereby GRANTED. Applicant may engage in the practice pharmacy without the presence of another Pharmacist for up to sixteen (16) hours per week.
2. Applicant's request for a reduction in drug and alcohol screens is hereby GRANTED. Applicant's frequency is reduced to not less than fourteen (14) screens per year and one (1) annual hair test while Applicant is not working as a Pharmacist. Upon providing proof of employment as a Pharmacist, Applicant's frequency shall be increased to no less than twenty-four (24) screens per year and one (1) annual hair test.
3. All other terms and conditions of the Order not otherwise modified remain in full force and effect.
4. This order is effective the date of its signing.
