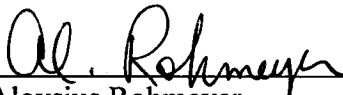

You are hereby notified that you are subject to an administrative forfeiture of \$1,000.00 in accordance with Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 305.125(1)(b). This forfeiture must be paid within 30 days of the date of mailing of this Notice, or a 12% interest penalty will be assessed.

You have the right to request a review of the assessment of forfeiture by sending a request to the Division Administrator, Division of Industry Services, P.O. Box 2658, Madison, Wisconsin 53701-2658, which must be received by the Division no later than 30 days from the date of mailing of this Notice. Any review of the assessment of forfeiture will be held in accordance with the requirements set forth in Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 305.125(6-8).

You are receiving this administrative forfeiture because you performed plumbing without the proper license and admitted to performing plumbing work as defined by Wis. Stat. § 145.01(10)(a)(1) when you replaced and installed a vanity sink and shower, connected the fixtures to the existing plumbing, and installed an S-trap on the sink drain. Your actions violated Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 305.90(1)(a). The administrative forfeiture of \$1,000.00 is assessed in accordance with Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 305.125(1)(b).
