The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Wisconsin Board of Nursing (Board). The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent Jonathan L. Long, R.N., (DOB October 3, 1963) is licensed in the state of Wisconsin as a professional nurse, having license number 184922-30, first issued on January 11, 2012, and current through February 28, 2020. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department) is 1707 Rowland Avenue, Apartment 1, Madison, Wisconsin 53704-4109.

2. At all times relevant to this proceeding, Respondent was employed as a in home professional nurse at a patient's home, located in Fitchburg, Wisconsin.

3. Respondent was providing in-home care to a one-and-a-half-year-old patient (Patient A) who was on a ventilator.

4. Patient A's parents had an audio and video monitor in Patient A's room. All nursing staff were aware this monitor was in the room. The monitor was frequently used by nursing staff to communicate with the family, who were in different areas of the home.

5. On January 31, 2018, Respondent was providing nursing cares to Patient A. Patient A was in his crib and did not need immediate attention. Patient A's father logged into the monitor from outside of the home because he had missed a call and thought there may be a concern with his son, Patient A.

6. When the father logged into the camera, he discovered Respondent was exposing his penis and appeared to be masturbating.

7. The video revealed that Patient A was not neglected or in need of cares during this time; Respondent was still present to provide cares, if necessary; Respondent was watching a media device; and, the patient was not involved with Respondent's conduct.

8. At one point during the video, Respondent looked up at the camera, looked around, and then found a piece of paper to cover the camera.

9. In resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Board of Nursing has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07, and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Jonathan L. Long, R.N., violated Wis. Admin. Code § N 7.03(4)(f)1.a., by engaging in sexually explicit conduct, sexual contact, exposure, gratification, or other sexual behavior with or in the presence of a patient.

3. As a result of the above conduct, Jonathan L. Long, R.N., is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07(1g)(b) and (d).

ORDER

1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.

2. The SURRENDER of the license and privilege of Jonathan L. Long, R.N., (license no. 184922-30) to practice nursing in the State of Wisconsin or under another state license pursuant to the Enhanced Nurse Licensure Compact is hereby accepted.

3. In the event Respondent petitions the Board of Nursing for reinstatement as a nurse in the future, the Board may enter an order denying such application without further notice or hearing. Whether to grant a license and whether to impose any limitations or restrictions on any license granted shall be in the discretion of the Board.

4. Within 120 days from the date of this Order, Respondent shall pay COSTS of this matter in the amount of \$767.00.

5. Payment of costs (made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services) shall be sent by Respondent to the Department Monitor at the address below:

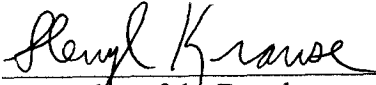

STIPULATION

Division of Legal Services and Compliance Case No. 18 NUR 067

Respondent Jonathan L. Long, R.N., and the Division of Legal Services and Compliance,
Department of Safety and Professional Services stipulate as follows:

1. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation by the
Division of Legal Services and Compliance. Respondent consents to the resolution of this
investigation by Stipulation.

2. Respondent understands that by signing this Stipulation, Respondent voluntarily
and knowingly waives the following rights:

- the right to a hearing on the allegations against Respondent, at which time the State has
the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
- the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against Respondent;
- the right to call witnesses on Respondent's behalf and to compel their attendance by
subpoena;
- the right to testify on Respondent's own behalf;
- the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral
arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision;
- the right to petition for rehearing; and
- all other applicable rights afforded to Respondent under the United States Constitution,
the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code,
and other provisions of state or federal law.

3. Respondent is aware of Respondent's right to seek legal representation and has
been provided an opportunity to obtain legal counsel before signing this Stipulation.

4. Respondent agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by
the Wisconsin Board of Nursing (Board). The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of
the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of
the parties. Respondent waives all rights to any appeal of the Board's order, if adopted in the
form as attached.

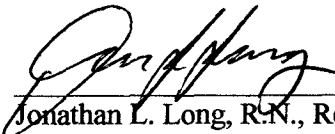
5. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not
be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall then be returned to the Division

of Legal Services and Compliance for further proceedings. In the event that the Stipulation is not accepted by the Board, the parties agree not to contend that the Board has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.

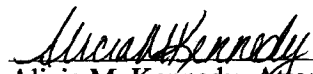
6. The parties to this Stipulation agree that the attorney or other agent for the Division of Legal Services and Compliance and any member of the Board ever assigned as an advisor in this investigation may appear before the Board in open or closed session, without the presence of Respondent, for purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that any member of the Board may have in connection with deliberations on the Stipulation. Additionally, any such advisor may vote on whether the Board should accept this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.

7. Respondent is informed that should the Board adopt this Stipulation, the Board's Final Decision and Order is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard Department procedure.

8. The Division of Legal Services and Compliance joins Respondent in recommending the Board adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
