You are hereby notified that you are subject to an administrative forfeiture of **\$250.00** in accordance with Wis. Stat. § 101.88(3) for your engagement in electrical work while your license was expired in violation of Wis. Stat. § 101.862 and Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 305.40. This forfeiture must be paid within 30 days of the date of mailing of this Notice, or a 12% interest penalty will be assessed and/or enforcement action may be taken against you.

The forfeiture of **\$250.00** shall be made out to the "Department of Safety and Professional Services." Include in the memo line "17 COM 157" and send to the following address:

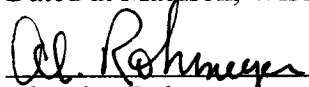
You have the right to request a review of the assessment of forfeiture by sending a request to the Division Administrator, Division of Industry Services, P.O. Box 7302, Madison, Wisconsin 53707-7302, which must be received by the Division no later than 30 days from the date of mailing of this Notice. Any review of the assessment of forfeiture will be held in accordance with the requirements set forth in Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 305.125(6-8). In your request you must include a statement of the specific reasons why you believe the administrative forfeiture and the grounds for the assessment should be overturned. Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 305.125(6)(a)(3). Any issues not addressed in your statement shall be deemed waived for

consideration by the Department at the hearing, and the Department shall only consider the reasons specified in your statement. Wis. Stat. § 101.02(6)(f).

You are receiving this administrative forfeiture because you did not hold the appropriate electrical license when you performed work at 4450 Yellow Birch Road, Eagle River, WI 54521. An investigation was opened regarding potential building code violations at the above address and it was determined during that investigation that you engaged in electrical work while unlicensed. A search of Wisconsin records returned no results of you holding the appropriate licenses as required by Wisconsin statutes and code. Further, on June 6, 2018, you admitted to performing electrical work at the site without a valid license.

For these reasons the administrative forfeiture of \$250.00 is assessed in accordance with Wis. Stat. § 101.88(3).
