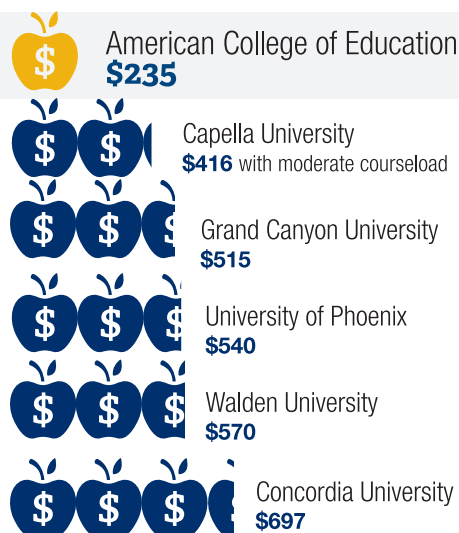

Candidates gain understanding of child development as they learn and apply instructional and assessment strategies to improve achievement of elementary students' achievement in reading, mathematics, social studies, and science.
	M.A. in Secondary Teaching	34	19-20	This program is designed for individuals who hold a bachelor's degree in a field other than education and who decide to become secondary teachers. This program leads to secondary teacher certification in Indiana. Candidates gain understanding of adolescent development as they learn and apply instructional and assessment strategies to improve achievement of secondary students' in content specific areas.

PROGRAM	Certificate in Transition to Teaching in Elementary Education	24	14-15	This program prepares candidates to manage K-6 classrooms. Candidates research best practices and ways to guide their students toward success. Candidates master the foundations of literacy, learn how to integrate digital technology into their instruction, and enter the classroom with student teaching experience. The graduate certificate program leads to an initial elementary generalist teacher license in Indiana. All courses in this program can be applied to a Master of Arts in Elementary Teaching at American College of Education.
