Notice to Students

Your training may take longer than stated on Page 1 as your Scheduled Completion Date. In stage 10 of this course, you will participate in actual animal training sessions (“Externship”). As part of this course you will be assigned a trainer (“Mentor”) whom you will work with in your Externship. It is possible that, you may be delayed in completing your training due to scheduling delays or inclement weather. Animal Behavior College, Inc. makes every effort to continue your training without any delays; however, if there is a problem in scheduling your Externship when you finish stage 9, you may experience a delay of up to several months in completing your course. As noted above, seasonal considerations including weather could delay the completion of your course.

Cancelled Externship - Occasionally and due to a variety of reasons ABC may elect to cancel an Externship prior to completion. If this occurs ABC may schedule a new Externship (“Reset”). In the event a Reset is required, it is likely the externship hours, already completed, will need to be repeated. This will be at ABC’s sole discretion. In the event of a Reset due to cancellation, ABC will make every effort to continue your training with minimal interruption; however the student understands that delays of up to several months could occur before the Reset is scheduled. If this happens, the student understands and agrees that it will not be considered a breach of contract by ABC nor grounds for cancellation of the program.

Failed Externship - Occasionally a student may fail all or part of an Externship. If this occurs ABC will counsel the student and may elect to Reset another Externship in full or part based solely on ABC’s judgment of the situation. In the event of a Reset due to a failed Externship, ABC will make every effort to continue your training with minimal interruption; however the student understands that delays of up to several months could occur before the Reset is scheduled. In the event of a Reset due to a failed externship, the student understands they may be charged for the additional externship and it may be necessary for them to travel outside of their agreed maximum mileage as stated in Exhibit A. The student understands and agrees that any delays in their Externship due to a Reset of a failed Externship, will not be considered a breach of contract by ABC nor grounds for cancellation of the program.

Your training may not be at a location close to your lodging. In stage 10 of this course, you will participate in an Externship. The location of the Externship will be as close to your local area as possible, but you may have to travel to a location outside your local area. The Externship could be held in a public park, a pet store, or other location as determined by the Mentor. You will be contacted by Animal Behavior College, Inc. as to where and when the Externship will be provided. Every effort is made to provide your Externship as close to you as possible and at a time that is convenient for you.

As part of signing this Agreement, I understand that there could be possible delays in completing my training and that such delay could be even greater if a Reset is required. I also understand that I will complete my Externship in a location determined by Animal Behavior College, Inc. This location may not be in my local area.

Maximum Program Completion Time

Students are expected to complete their program within the defined maximum program completion time, which can not exceed 1.5 times the normal duration. ABC defines the normal duration as the length of time it would take a student to complete the total program credit hours.

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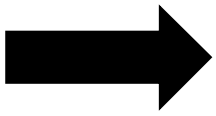
Initial _____

This course prepares the student for entry-level employment in the business of dog training so that they can independently handle the training of canines. Specific objectives include: (1) Learning the basics of dog breed characteristics, developmental periods, proper socialization, basic health routines, disease prevention and canine communication (2) Learning basic training principles along with many specific training strategies, including, classical conditioning and operant conditioning (3) Learning about training tools, such as, clickers, collars, leashes, housetraining aids, chewing deterrents, interactive toys, and safety equipment (4) Learning the history of dog training and the differences between obedience training, behavior modification and problem solving (5) Learning the step-by-step instructions on how to teach basic obedience cues (6) Learning how to effectively treat the most common behavioral problems in dogs, e.g. housebreaking, house manners, puppy nipping, chewing, digging, jumping, excessive barking, and begging (7) Learning basic safety guidelines for working with dogs (8) Learning public speaking and methods to use for conveying training lessons clearly and effectively to dog owners and how to conduct group classes (9) Learning how to create a business plan, how to create a budget, and how to successfully market a pet training business (10) Externship (10a) Pet First Aid and CPR Certification Course teaches the knowledge needed to respond safely and effectively to animal emergencies, like choking, heat stroke and bleeding injuries, how to perform CPR on dogs and cats, and many other valuable life saving skills. Initial Pet First Aid and CPR certification is valid for two years (11) Final Exam.

While ABC does not promise or guarantee a job, ABC does assist with resume writing, interviewing techniques, job-search skills, and subsequent follow-up.

ABC EXTERNSHIP AND ABC STUDENT PLEDGE

ABC agrees to make every reasonable effort to assign the student a qualified ABC Dog Trainer nearest to them. The Student agrees and understands that it may be necessary for him/her to travel within a minimum radius of _____ miles from their residence in order to participate in the Externship portion of the ABC program. The maximum radius the student agrees to travel in order to participate in the Externship portion of the ABC program is _____ miles from their residence. The student agrees that if the student moves from their current residence, the mileage requirements are subject to change by ABC. While we understand that some students do not have control over being relocated, it is important that all students understand that the externship portion of the program must be completed in the United States or Canada. Student must arrange their own, reliable transportation, to and from Externship location.

The student understands the exact training location and training times will be based on the availability of the Trainer, once they reach this stage of the program. Students understand and agree that they will need to be flexible regarding the dates and times ABC assigns for the Externship portion of the program. ABC does not guarantee any specific training dates or times.

The student understands they may be required to bring a 'friendly' dog with them as part of their Externship. The student understands that a friendly dog is defined as a dog that is friendly and comfortable with people, as well as friendly and comfortable with other dogs. Very importantly, the student's dog must not show any aggressive behavior including but not limited to snarling, growling, or biting people or other dogs. The student understands and agrees that the Trainer will ultimately determine if a dog is classified as 'a friendly dog'.

During this stage of the program, the student will observe the trainer's methods of teaching basic obedience cues and solving basic behavioral challenges. The student will also be required to practice and demonstrate what they have observed in addition to verbally explaining the step by step process of individual cues. The student will be evaluated on their personal conduct, their observation ability, their aptitude for training dogs and their ability to verbally explain each training process.

Externship Facility Requirements -While ABC does not require a background check for students, some Externship facilities may require that a student successfully pass a criminal background check and/or drug screen prior to acceptance. Externship facilities may also require certain inoculations prior to the Student starting the Externship in their facility (example: rabies, tetanus vaccination, etc). The Student understands and agrees to follow the Externship facility's protocol, including, but not limited to, incurring the costs of any screening or inoculations that the facility may require.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS AND ASSUMPTION OF RISK

There can be risk of infectious disease, including parasites, which can be transmitted from animal to human (zoonotic diseases). I also understand that I may not be aware of all the potential risks associated with participation in the program but nevertheless I elect voluntarily to participate and am willing to accept the risks.

I also understand that if I am pregnant or become pregnant during the course of my program, I am advised to consult my physician before attending Externship portion of the program. I understand that attendance of Externship sessions may endanger the health of both myself and unborn baby due to potential exposure to chemicals, parasites such as toxoplasmosis, pesticides, anesthetic and/or pharmaceutical agents and substances including x-radiation that is known to cause birth defects and miscarriage. I understand that due to health concerns and/or restrictions imposed by mentors, pregnant students may be unable to attend Externship sessions during their pregnancy. I understand that if I do not successfully complete the Externship portion of the program, I will not receive certification.

Knowing the risks described above, and in consideration of being permitted to participate in the program, I agree to assume all the risks and responsibilities resulting from my participation in the program. REFUND PROVISIONS - BUYER'S RIGHT TO CANCEL-Students have the right to cancel this Agreement from a course of instruction at any time. If cancellation from the course of instruction is after the period allowed for cancellation of the agreement, Animal Behavior College, Inc. may pay a refund. This cancellation period extends until midnight of the seventh business day following your password protected access to the Animal Behavior College, Inc., online Study Materials. Cancellation shall occur when you give written notice of cancellation to Steven Appelbaum, Director, 25104 Rye Canyon Loop, Santa Clarita, CA 91355. You can do this by mail, hand delivery, email or facsimile. The written notice of cancellation, if sent by mail, is effective when deposited in the mail properly addressed with postage prepaid. The written notice of cancellation need not take any particular form and, however expressed, it is effective if it shows that you no longer wish to be bound by this Agreement.

Study Materials are charged separately and may be returned for refund if they are in new, unopened condition and returned to Animal Behavior College, Inc. within 30 days following the date of the student's written request for cancellation. Animal Behavior College, Inc. shall refund the amount charged for the Study Materials upon receipt of the Study Materials in new, unopened condition. If the student fails to return the Study Materials in new, unopened condition, within 30 days following the date of the student's written request for cancellation, Animal Behavior College, Inc. may offset the tuition refund by the amount charged for the Study Materials.

WITHDRAWAL FROM COURSE-Students have the right to withdraw from a course of instruction at any time. If a student withdraws from the course of instruction after the period allowed for cancellation of the agreement, the student may be eligible for a refund, less a registration fee not to exceed \$75.00. Refund of the Technology Fee is solely based on the number of stages student had access to prior to cancellation. Animal Behavior College, Inc., will pay any refund due within 40 days following confirmation of the student's written withdrawal. If the student paid for the course, the refund will be paid to the student. If an agency or third party paid for the course, the refund will be paid to the agency or third party.

The student is obligated to pay for the educational services rendered. Any refund shall be determined by a) the dollar amount paid for tuition, b) the number of stages not yet completed and c) any amount owed for Study Materials never received or any amount owed for Study Materials returned in new, unopened condition. The eligible tuition refund amount is calculated by taking the contracted tuition amount, subtracting any payment plan adjustment, then dividing that dollar amount by the total number of stages in the program, and then multiplying that amount by the total number of stages not yet completed.

No refund is required for any student who withdraws or is dismissed after completing 60% of the potential lessons of instruction. If the amount that the student owes is more than the amount that the student has already paid, the student is responsible for that outstanding balance and agrees to make arrangements for re-payment that are satisfactory to ABC.

The student is deemed to have withdrawn from the course when any of the following occurs:

- a) The student notifies Animal Behavior College, Inc., of the withdrawal in writing.
- b) Animal Behavior College, Inc. terminates the student's enrollment.
- c) The student has failed to submit three consecutive lessons or has failed to submit a completed lesson within 60 days of its due date. For the purpose of this paragraph, the date of the student's withdrawal shall be deemed to be the 61st day after the last completed lesson.

AGREEMENT TO ARBITRATE DISPUTES

In the event there is a dispute, claim or controversy between me and Animal Behavior College, Inc. ("ABC") (and/or its directors, officers, employees or agents) relating to or arising out of my enrollment and/or participation in any course of study offered to me by ABC, and the parties are unable to resolve same through direct discussion, regardless of the kind or type of dispute, ABC and I agree to submit all such claims and disputes exclusively to final and binding arbitration under the Federal Arbitration Act (in conformity with the procedures of the California Arbitration Act, Cal. Code Civ. Proc. sec. 1280 *et seq.*, if applicable).

It is expressly agreed that the claims which are to be arbitrated under this agreement include, but are not limited to, claims for tuition, materials fees, failure to educate and other compensation, claims for breach of contract (express or implied), claims for violation of public policy, wrongful dismissal from any ABC course of study, tort claims, claims for fraud, nondisclosure and misrepresentation, claims for unlawful discrimination, harassment, and/or retaliation to the extent allowed by law, and claims for violation of any federal, state, or other government law, statute, regulation, or ordinance. The claims which are to be arbitrated under this agreement include, without limitation, claims under (a) the Americans with Disabilities Act, (b) the federal Fair Trade Commission Act; (c) the California Private Postsecondary and Vocational Education Reform Act; (d) the Consumer Legal Remedies Act; (e) the California Unfair Competition Law; and (f) the Unruh Civil Rights Act, (g) the California Disabled Persons Act, and (h) and all similar state laws. Each party retains the right to seek injunctive and equitable relief in aid of arbitration, to the extent permitted by law.

Any dispute, controversy or claim covered by or arising out of this agreement to arbitrate disputes shall be resolved through binding arbitration administered by the American Arbitration Association ("AAA") in accordance with the AAA Consumer Arbitration Rules (the "Rules"). These Rules are available at: <http://www.adr.org/> The Rules may also be obtained by calling 1-800-778-7879.

There shall be one arbitrator as mutually agreed by the parties. If the parties are unable to agree on an arbitrator, the arbitrator shall be chosen in accordance with the Rules. Each party shall have the right to conduct reasonable discovery, as determined by the arbitrator, to the extent permitted by the Rules.

This agreement to arbitrate does not prevent me from filing a charge or complaint with any government agency. It also does not prevent me from participating in any investigation or proceeding conducted by an agency. However, if one of these agencies issues a right to sue notice, binding arbitration under this agreement will be my sole remedy.

To the extent permitted by law without impairing the enforceability of this arbitration agreement, ABC and I agree that each shall only submit their own, individual claims in arbitration and will not seek to represent the interests of any other person and that each will not assert class or representative claims against the other in arbitration. To the extent permitted by law without impairing the enforceability of this arbitration agreement, ABC and I further agree that class action and representative action procedures shall not be asserted or permitted in arbitration. Claims brought by me or by ABC may not be joined or consolidated in the arbitration with claims brought by or against any other students or graduates, unless agreed to in writing by all parties.

The arbitrator shall have all powers conferred by law and a judgment may be entered on the award by a court of law having jurisdiction. The arbitrator shall render a written arbitration award that contains the essential findings and conclusions on which the award is based. Following the issuance of the arbitrator's decision, either party may petition a court to confirm, enforce, correct or vacate the arbitrator's opinion and award under the Federal Arbitration Act, and/or applicable state law.

I will pay the AAA initial filing fee, up to a maximum of \$200. Once I pay this initial fee, ABC will pay the arbitrator's fees and costs, as well as any additional AAA administrative fees. Except to the extent otherwise provided by law, the parties shall each pay the fees of their own attorneys and the expenses of their own witnesses.

This agreement shall be interpreted in such a manner as to be effective and valid under applicable law. However, if any provision of this agreement is held, determined or adjudicated to be invalid, unenforceable or void for any reason, each such provision shall be severed from the remaining provisions of the agreement and shall not affect the validity and enforceability of such remaining provisions.
