The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Wisconsin Real Estate Appraisers Board (Board). The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

## FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Licensee Chris G. Dobrinski (DOB June 1, 1956) is licensed by the State of Wisconsin as a Certified General Appraiser, having certificate of licensure and certification number 10-10, first issued on July 10, 1991 and current through December 14, 2019. Licensee's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department) is 8690 Ranchwood Road, Minocqua, Wisconsin 54548.
- 2. On October 30, 2017, Licensee performed an appraisal of property located at 12073 Kobart Road, Minocqua, Wisconsin 54548.
- 3. On or about January 16, 2018, the Department received a complaint alleging that the subject appraisal violated the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice

- (USPAP). Division of Legal Services and Compliance Case Number 18 APP 002 was subsequently opened for investigation.
- 4. Licensee's appraisal was reviewed by the Division of Legal Services and Compliance and was found to be deficient in the following ways:
  - a. Licensee failed to support his adjustments to comparables for differences in water frontage in his workfile. [Record Keeping Rule.]
  - b. In the Sales Comparison Approach section, Licensee adjusted Comparable Sale #1 -\$19,500 for site size, but then stated the comparable has more frontage but has irregular topography and thus is equal in site value to the subject property. [Standards Rules (SR) 2-1(b).]
  - c. In the Sales Comparison Approach section, Licensee incorrectly reported that Comparable Sale #3 had no basement and failed to adequately research the enclosed porch. Licensee incorrectly reported that Comparable Sale #4 only had one bathroom. [SR 1-1(c), SR 1-4(a), SR 2-1(a).]
  - d. In the Sales Comparison Approach section, Licensee made a -\$5,000 adjustment for Comparable Sale #1 having a boat house. Licensee failed to report that Comparable Sale #4 had a boat house and made no adjustment. [SR 1-1(c), SR 1-4(a), SR 2-1(a).]
- 5. This Stipulation is not in any way an admission to the allegations in the complaint.
- 6. Licensee agrees that failure to submit proof of successful completion of the ordered education as set forth below shall constitute conduct which reflects adversely on his fitness to practice as a real estate appraiser as set forth in Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 86.01(13).
- 7. In resolution of this matter, Licensee consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

## CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Real Estate Appraisers Board is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. §§ 227.44(5) and 458.26.

#### ORDER

- 1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.
- 2. Within 90 days of the date of this Order, Chris G. Dobrinski shall, at his own expense, take and successfully complete 24 hours of education as follows:
  - a. USPAP (15 hours) (must be taken online);

- b. Data Verification Methods (5 hours) (may be taken online or in a classroom setting); and
- c. Workfile Documentation for Appraisers (4 hours) (may be taken online or in a classroom setting).
- d. Each course attended in satisfaction of this Order must be offered by a provider pre-approved by the Board or its designee. Licensee shall be responsible for locating course(s) satisfactory to the Board and for obtaining the required approval of the course(s) from the Board or its designee. Licensee must take and pass any exam(s) offered for the course(s).
- e. Licensee shall submit proof of successful completion of the education in the form of verification from the institution providing the education to the Department Monitor at the address stated below. None of the education completed pursuant to this requirement may be used to satisfy any continuing education requirements that have been or may be instituted by the Board or Department and may not be used in any future attempt to upgrade a credential.
- 3. Requests for course approval and proof of successful course completion shall be sent by Licensee to the Department Monitor at the address below:

Licensee Chris G. Dobrinski and the Division of Legal Services and Compliance, Department of Safety and Professional Services, stipulate as follows:

- 1. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation by the Division of Legal Services and Compliance. Licensee consents to the resolution of this investigation by Stipulation.
- 2. Licensee understands that by signing this Stipulation, Licensee voluntarily and knowingly waives the following rights:
  - the right to a hearing on the allegations against Licensee, at which time the State
    has the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
  - · the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against Licensee;
  - the right to call witnesses on Licensec's behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena;
  - · the right to testify on Licensee's own behalf;
  - the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision;
  - · the right to petition for rehearing; and
  - all other applicable rights afforded to Licensee under the United States
     Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin
     Administrative Code, and other provisions of state or federal law.
- 3. Licensee is aware of Licensee's right to seek legal representation and has been provided an opportunity to obtain legal counsel before signing this Stipulation. Licensee is represented by Attorney Erik H. Monson.
- 4. Licensee agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order for Remedial Education by the Wisconsin Real Estate Appraisers Board (Board). The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Licensee waives all rights to any appeal of the Board's order, if adopted in the form as attached.
- 5. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall then be

returned to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further proceedings. In the event that the Stipulation is not accepted by the Board, the parlies agree not to contend that the Board has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.

- The parties to this Stipulation agree that the attorney or other agent for the Division of Legal Services and Compliance and any member of the Board ever assigned as an advisor in this investigation may appear before the Board in open or closed session, without the presence of Licensee, for purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that any member of the Board may have in connection with deliberations on the Stipulation. Additionally, any such advisor may vote on whether the Board should accept this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
- Licensee is informed that should the Board adopt this Stipulation, the Board's Final Decision and Order is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard Department procedure.
- The Division of Legal Services and Compliance joins Licensee in recommending the Board adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
