FINDINGS OF FACT

- I. DEMETRIUS BOOSE (Applicant) has filed an application for reinstatement of a Wisconsin private security person permit (# 52614-108).
- II. After careful review of his file, it was determined that Applicant's criminal convictions substantially related to the practice of a private security person and, on May 28, 2015, Applicant was mailed a Stipulation and Order Granting Limited License (Order).
- III. At that time, information on file established that Applicant had the following criminal convictions:
  - A. On or about January 25, 2005 – Criminal Damage to Property, a misdemeanor.
  - B. On or about January 25, 2005 – Disorderly Conduct, a misdemeanor.
  - C. On or about June 19, 2013 – Resisting/Obstructing an Officer, a misdemeanor.
- IV. Applicant signed the Stipulation indicating that he agreed "...to accept an Order Granting a Limited License as a private security permit subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the attached Order Adopting Stipulation."
- V. On June 17, 2015, the Department issued Applicant a limited private security permit (#52614-108) in accordance with the Stipulation and Order.

- VI. The Order included the condition that “Violation of any of the terms of this Order may be construed as conduct imperiling public health, safety and welfare and may result in a summary suspension of Applicant’s license. The Department, in its discretion, may, in the alternative, impose additional conditions and limitations or other additional discipline for a violation of any of the terms of this Order. In the event that the Applicant fails to submit quarterly reports as ordered, Applicant’s license may, in the discretion of the Department or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Applicant has complied with the terms of this order.”
- VII. The Order included the requirement to “...report any arrest or conviction within 48 hours of the arrest or entry of conviction.”
- VIII. Information on file establishes that, since the issuance of the Limited License, Applicant failed to maintain compliance with the terms and conditions of the Order. Applicant did not provide timely quarterly work reports, had negative work reports, and obtained a further violation and criminal conviction, including:
  - A. On or about February 3, 2016 – Operating While Intoxicated, an ordinance violation.
  - B. On or about May 6, 2016 – Go Armed with Firearm While Intoxicated, a misdemeanor.
- IX. Department records indicate Applicant did not report the new above-listed violation and conviction to the Department, as required.
- X. Applicant was denied a renewal of his Private Security Permit on March 8, 2017.
- XI. On or about February 7, 2018, Applicant submitted an application for reinstatement, with no new convictions reported.
- XII. Applicant has been convicted of a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence and therefore, he is permanently prohibited from possessing a firearm, per 18 U.S.C. § 922(g)(9).

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- I. The Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services has jurisdiction over this matter, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.26.
- II. The facts and circumstances of the convictions and violations referenced above substantially relate(s) to the practice of a private security person. Applicant, by his conduct, is subject to action against his license, pursuant to Wis. Stat. §§ 111.335(2)(b), 440.08(4), and 440.26(6) and Wis. Admin. Code chs. SPS 31 and 35.

## ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that DEMETRIUS BOOSE is GRANTED a RENEWAL FOR A PRIVATE SECURITY PERMIT SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS, TERMS, AND CONDITIONS:

### Practice Limitations

- A.1 Applicant shall show a copy of this Order to his current and any future employer. Applicant shall provide the Department of Safety and Professional Services Monitor (Department Monitor) with written acknowledgement from each employer that a copy of this Order has been received. Such acknowledgement shall be provided to the Department Monitoring within fourteen (14) days of beginning new employment and/or within fourteen (14) days of the date of this Order for employment current as of the date of this Order.

### Reporting Requirements

- A.2 It is Applicant's responsibility to arrange for his security guard supervisor(s) to provide work reports to the Department Monitor on a quarterly basis, beginning 90 days from the date of this Order. These reports shall describe the Applicant's activities and verify that he is in compliance with the laws governing the practice of a private security person and the terms of this Order.
- A.3 Applicant shall report to the Department any change of employment status, residence, address or telephone number within five (5) days of the date of a change. In addition, Applicant shall commit no new violations of law and shall report all law enforcement contacts leading to arrest, charge, or conviction, including DWI/OWI and municipal/ordinance violations, to the Department Monitor within 48 hours of any such event, including any convictions resulting from pending charges.
- A.4 Applicant is responsible for compliance with all of the terms and conditions of this Order, including the timely submission of reports by others. Applicant shall promptly notify the Department Monitor of any suspected violations of any of the terms and conditions of this Order by Applicant.

### Department Monitor

- A.5 The Department Monitor is the individual designated by the department as its agent to coordinate compliance with the terms of this Order. Any requests, petitions, reports or other information required by this Order shall be mailed, faxed or delivered to:

#### Firearms Ban

- A.6 Applicant shall not apply for a Firearms Permit with the Department.
- A.7 Applicant shall not apply for employment in any position that might require or allow him/her to work in an armed capacity.
- A.8 The firearms ban is permanent and may not be modified while the limited license is in effect or at any time thereafter, unless the conviction has been expunged or set aside, or is an offense for which the person has been pardoned or has had civil rights restored (if the law of the applicable jurisdiction provides for the loss of civil rights under such an offense) unless the pardon, expungement, or restoration of civil rights expressly provides that the person may not ship, transport, possess, or receive firearms, under 18 U.S.C. § 921(a)(33)(B)(ii).

#### Petitions for Modification

- A.9 Applicant may petition the Department for modification of the terms of this Order after completion of one (1) year of practice in compliance with all terms and conditions of this Order. The firearms ban is permanent and may not be modified while the limited license is in effect or at any time thereafter, unless the conviction falls under 18 U.S.C. § 921(a)(33)(B)(ii). Applicant's petition must include his history of employment from the effective date of this Order that states the dates and names of any employer, such employment in total equaling one (1) year of practice. Any such petition shall be accompanied by a written recommendation from Applicant's current employer that includes, among other things, the dates of employment and scope of responsibility during such employment, and, if applicable, his treatment provider expressly supporting the specific modifications sought. A denial of such a petition for modification shall not be deemed a denial of license under Wis. Stat. §§ 227.01(3), or 227.42, or Wis. Admin. Code ch. SPS 1, and shall not be subject to any right to further hearing or appeal.
- A.10 "Practice in compliance" includes the submission of work reports and/or Treater reports, the content of which are satisfactory to the Department or its designee.

#### Costs


- A.11 Applicant shall be responsible for all costs and expenses associated with compliance with the terms of this Order.

#### Suspension

- A.12 In the event that Applicant violates any term of this Order, Applicant's license may, in the discretion of the Department or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Applicant has complied with the terms of the Order. The Department may,

in addition and/or in the alternative, refer any violation of this Order to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further investigation and action.



It is hereby stipulated between the above-referenced Applicant and the State of Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department) as follows:

- I. The Applicant has filed an application for reinstatement of a Private Security Person permit.
- II. Information received by the Department reflects a basis for denial of the license renewal application.
- III. Based upon the information of record herein, the Department agrees to issue and the Applicant agrees to accept an Order Granting a Limited License for reinstatement of a Private Security Person permit, subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the attached Order adopting the Stipulation.
- IV. Applicant understands that by signing this Stipulation, Applicant voluntarily and knowingly waives the following rights:
  - a) the right to request a hearing related to the denial of the renewal application;
  - b) assuming a hearing takes place wherein the State has the burden of proof by a preponderance of the evidence:
    - i. the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against Applicant;
    - ii. the right to call witnesses on Applicant's behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena;
    - iii. the right to testify on Applicant's own behalf;
    - iv. the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision;
    - v. the right to petition for rehearing; and
  - c) all other applicable rights afforded to Applicant under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code, and other provisions of state or federal law.

- V. Applicant is aware of Applicant's right to seek legal representation and has been provided an opportunity to obtain legal counsel before signing this Stipulation.
- VI. Applicant agrees to the adoption of the attached Order Granting Limited License by the Department. The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Order Granting Limited License without further notice, appearance, or consent of the parties.
- VII. Applicant waives all rights to any appeal of the Department's Order, as adopted in the form as attached.
- VIII. Applicant is informed that the Order Granting Limited License is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard Department procedure.
