You are hereby notified that your Electrical Contractor Licenses (Nos. 935444 & 928171) are suspended for twenty-eight (28) days starting September 23, 2019, and expiring October 20, 2019.

The basis for this suspension is your negligence in your responsibilities as an electrical contractor at 2095 Uphoff Road, Cottage Grove, Wisconsin. An investigation into the work done at this site found over thirty (30) electrical violations less than six (6) months after you completed the project. This is negligent behavior as defined by Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 305.10 as you failed to exercise the degree of care and judgment to protect public health and safety normally expected of an individual performing activities within the scope of your license and registration.

Wis. Admin. Code § 305.10(2)(a)2 states that the department may suspend or revoke a license or registration for negligence, incompetence or misconduct in the practice or work allowed by the license or registration. Work that is not up to code standards is considered negligence.

The suspension of 28 days is appropriate because the high number of code violations puts the public at risk as the state relies on competent individuals to perform electrical work to protect the public that the electrical work being done is completed by qualified individuals.

After the suspension, you may request, in writing, to have your credential reinstated. The reinstatement process is set forth in Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 305.10(1)(f). You can request

reinstatement by emailing DSPSCREDTrades@wisconsin.gov. Further, the reinstatement shall not be granted until the forfeiture associated with this case is paid in full.
