### INVESTIGATION NOTES:

This DEPARTMENT ORDER is issued as a result of an inspection on the above referenced site.

The following violations were revealed:

**Violation:** Commercial oven installed lacks proper HVAC hood and makeup air.

**Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 361.05(3) Adoption of the International Codes.** *Imc. The International Mechanical Code®* – 2015, subject to the modifications specified in this chapter and ch. SPS 364 is incorporated by reference into chs. SPS 361 to 366.

**2015 IMC 507.3** Type II hoods shall be installed above dishwashers and appliances that produce heat or moisture and do not produce grease or smoke as a result of the cooking process, except where the heat and moisture loads from such appliances are incorporated into the HVAC system design or into the design of a separate removal system.

**2015 IMC 508.1 Makeup air.** Makeup air shall be supplied during the operation of commercial kitchen exhaust systems that are provided for commercial cooking appliances.

**Suggested Action:** A type II hood shall be installed over the commercial stove or an engineered HVAC system that removes the excess heat and moisture shall be installed. Makeup air shall be provided for the exhaust system.



You are hereby ordered to have the installation corrected to conform to the indicated provisions of the Wisconsin Administrative Code and/or Wisconsin Statutes. This installation shall be corrected by the compliance date noted, and upon correction of violations I must be notified. If you fail to comply, this order is enforceable in circuit court pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 101.02(13), Stats., with forfeitures ranging from \$10 to \$100 per day for each violation.

If you have any questions regarding this matter, please feel free to contact me or the inspector at the numbers listed below.

**Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 303.03** Permits any person affected by a rule of the department to petition for a variance of the rule. The petition needs to establish equivalency to the rule, be provided on the form from the department and be submitted with accompanying fee and municipal recommendation.

**Wis. Stat. § 101.02(6)** Any employer or other person interested either because of ownership in or occupation of any property affected by any such order, or otherwise, may petition for a hearing on the reasonableness of any order of the department in the manner provided in this subchapter. All requests must be received within 30 days of the date of this Order and shall set out

specifically and in full detail the order upon which a hearing is desired and every reason why such order is unreasonable, and every issue to be considered by the department on the hearing. The petitioner shall be deemed to have finally waived all objections to any irregularities and illegalities in the order upon which a hearing is sought other than those set forth in the petition.
