The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Wisconsin Board of Nursing (Board). The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent Antoinette D. McGee, R.N., (DOB May 13, 1966) is licensed in the state of Wisconsin as a registered nurse, having license number 157163-30, first issued on January 3, 2007, and current through February 28, 2020. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department) is 3529 North 21st Street Apartment A, Milwaukee, Wisconsin 53206.

2. At all times relevant to this proceeding, Respondent was employed as a registered nurse at nurse staffing agency, located in Brookfield, Wisconsin.

3. On May 17, 2017, and May 18, 2017, Respondent worked as a fill-in nurse at a facility (Facility) in Wauwatosa, Wisconsin.

4. On May 18, 2017, at approximately 10:30 p.m., Respondent and Nurse A discovered that a fentanyl patch was missing. After an investigation, the Facility concluded that the patch fell off during the care of the patient.

5. During the investigation into the missing fentanyl patch, the Facility discovered discrepancies involving Respondent's documentation and administration of controlled substances.

6. On May 17, 2017, Respondent signed out one (1) hydrocodone-acetaminophen 7.5-325 mg tablet for Patient A at 4:00 p.m. and a second tablet at 8:00 p.m.

7. Patient A's order was for one (1) tablet three (3) times daily. The second tablet Respondent signed out for Patient A was outside the order, as it was the fourth tablet signed out for Patient A on that day.

8. Respondent documented administering one (1) tablet at 9:48 p.m. for Patient A. The tablet signed out at 4:00 p.m. was not documented as administered.

9. Between May 17, 2017, and May 18, 2017, Respondent signed out one (1) tablet of hydrocodone-acetaminophen 7.5-325 mg for Patient B, one (1) tablet of hydrocodone-acetaminophen 5-325 mg for Patient C, and one (1) capsule of Lyrica® 75 mg for Patient D after a medical technician had already signed out and administered the medications to these three (3) patients. The doses that Respondent signed out were outside of the order. Respondent did not document administering any of these medications.

10. Respondent was not permitted to return for future work at the Facility.

11. In resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Board of Nursing has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07, and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Antoinette D. McGee, R.N., violated Wis. Admin. Code § N 7.03(6)(c), by failing to conform to the minimal standards of acceptable nursing practice that may create unnecessary risk or danger to a patient's life, health, or safety.

3. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Antoinette D. McGee, R.N., violated Wis. Admin. Code § N 7.03(6)(a), by failing to perform nursing with reasonable skill and safety.

4. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Antoinette D. McGee, R.N., violated Wis. Admin. Code § N 7.03(8)(d), by error in prescribing, dispensing, or administering medication.

5. As a result of the above conduct, Antoinette D. McGee, R.N., is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07(1g)(b) and (d).

ORDER

1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.

2. Respondent Antoinette D. McGee, R.N., is REPRIMANDED.

3. The registered nursing license issued to Antoinette D. McGee, R.N., (license number 157163-30) and her privilege to practice in Wisconsin pursuant to the Enhanced Nurse Licensure Compact, is LIMITED as follows:

- a. Within ninety (90) days of the date of this Order, Respondent shall at her own expense, successfully complete four (4) hours of education on the topic of medication errors and five (5) hours on the topic of documentation offered by a provider pre-approved by the Board's monitoring liaison, including and passing any exam offered for the courses.
- b. Respondent shall submit proof of successful completion of the education in the form of verification from the institution providing the education to the Department Monitor at the address stated below. None of the education completed pursuant to this requirement may be used to satisfy any continuing education requirements that have been or may be instituted by the Board or Department, and also may not be used in future attempts to upgrade a credential in Wisconsin.
- c. This limitation shall be removed from Respondent's license after satisfying the Board or its designee that Respondent has successfully completed all of the ordered education.

4. Pursuant to the Enhanced Nurse Licensure Compact, Respondent's nursing practice is limited to Wisconsin during the pendency of this limitation.

5. Within 120 days from the date of this Order, Antoinette D. McGee, R.N., shall pay COSTS of this matter in the amount of \$1,067.00.

6. Request for approval of courses, proof of successful course completion and payment of costs (made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services) shall be sent by Respondent to the Department Monitor at the address below:



In the event Respondent violates any term of this Order, Respondent's license (157163-30), or Respondent's right to renew her license, may, in the discretion of the Board or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with the terms of the Order. The Board may, in addition and/or in the alternative refer any violation of this Order to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further investigation and action.

8. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.

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STIPULATION

Respondent Antoinette D. McGee, R.N., and the Division of Legal Services and Compliance, Department of Safety and Professional Services stipulate as follows:

1. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation by the Division of Legal Services and Compliance. Respondent consents to the resolution of this investigation by Stipulation.

2. Respondent understands that by signing this Stipulation, Respondent voluntarily and knowingly waives the following rights:

- the right to a hearing on the allegations against Respondent, at which time the State has the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
- the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against Respondent;
- the right to call witnesses on Respondent's behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena;
- the right to testify on Respondent's own behalf;
- the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision;
- the right to petition for rehearing; and
- all other applicable rights afforded to Respondent under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code, and other provisions of state or federal law.

3. Respondent is aware of Respondent's right to seek legal representation and has been provided an opportunity to obtain legal counsel before signing this Stipulation.

4. Respondent agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Wisconsin Board of Nursing (Board). The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Respondent waives all rights to any appeal of the Board's order, if adopted in the form as attached.


5. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall then be returned to the Division

of Legal Services and Compliance for further proceedings. In the event that the Stipulation is not accepted by the Board, the parties agree not to contend that the Board has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.


6. The parties to this Stipulation agree that the attorney or other agent for the Division of Legal Services and Compliance and any member of the Board ever assigned as an advisor in this investigation may appear before the Board in open or closed session, without the presence of Respondent, for purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that any member of the Board may have in connection with deliberations on the Stipulation. Additionally, any such advisor may vote on whether the Board should accept this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.

7. Respondent is informed that should the Board adopt this Stipulation, the Board's Final Decision and Order is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard Department procedure.

8. The Division of Legal Services and Compliance joins Respondent in recommending the Board adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
