The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Medical Examining Board (Board). The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Respondent Joseph M. Baker, D.O. (DOB May 7, 1953), is licensed in the State of Wisconsin to practice medicine and surgery, having license number 66707-21, first issued on December 21, 2016, with registration that expired on February 28, 2018. Respondent retains the appurtenant right to renew the registration of his license. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department) is 10777 Nall Avenue, Suite 315, Overland Park, Kansas 66211.
- 2. At all times pertinent to this matter, Respondent was practicing family medicine in the State of Kansas.

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- 3. On February 13, 2018, the Board of the Healing Arts of the State of Kansas (Kansas Board) issued a Consent Order which publicly censured Respondent, fined Respondent \$2,500, and placed Respondent's license to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery on probation until completion of continuing education on the topics of prescribing controlled drugs and medical record-keeping (Kansas Order). The Kansas Order was based on deficiencies in documentation, as well as inappropriate prescription of controlled substances, found during a review of records for seven (7) patients treated by Respondent.
 - 4. Respondent failed to report the Kansas Order to the Department.
- 5. Respondent provided verification to the Department that he is in full compliance with the Kansas Order including payment of the fine and completion of the continuing education. The probationary status of Respondent's Kansas license was removed by the Kansas Board on June 8, 2018.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Wisconsin Medical Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 448.02(3), and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).
- 2. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent Joseph M. Baker, D.O., engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined by Wis. Admin. Code § Med 10.03(3)(a) (2013) by failing, within 30 days, to report to the board any final adverse action taken against the licensee's authority to practice medicine and surgery by another licensing jurisdiction concerned with the practice of medicine and surgery.
- 3. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent Joseph M. Baker, D.O., engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined by Wis. Admin. Code § Med 10.03(3)(c) (2013) by having any credentialing pertaining to the practice of medicine and surgery or any act constituting the practice of medicine and surgery become subject to adverse determination by any agency or this or another state, or by any federal agency or authority.
- 4. As a result of the above conduct, Joseph M. Baker, D.O., is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 448.02(3).

ORDER

- 1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.
- 2. Respondent Joseph M. Baker, D.O., is REPRIMANDED.
- 3. Within 90 days from the date of this Order, Joseph M. Baker, D.O., shall pay COSTS of this matter in the amount of \$655.00
- 4. Payment of costs shall be made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services and sent to the Department Monitor at the address below:

The Board may, in addition and/or in the alternative refer any violation of this Order to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further investigation and action.
 - 6. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.

Respondent Joseph M. Baker, D.O. and the Division of Legal Services and Compliance, Department of Safety and Professional Services stipulate as follows:

- 1. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation by the Division of Legal Services and Compliance. Respondent consents to the resolution of this investigation by Stipulation.
- 2. Respondent understands that by signing this Stipulation, Respondent voluntarily and knowingly waives the following rights:
 - the right to a hearing on the allegations against Respondent, at which time the State has the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
 - the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against Respondent;
 - the right to call witnesses on Respondent's behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena;
 - the right to testify on Respondent's own behalf;
 - the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision;
 - the right to petition for rehearing; and
 - all other applicable rights afforded to Respondent under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code, and other provisions of state or federal law.
- 3. Respondent is aware of Respondent's right to seek legal representation and has been provided an opportunity to obtain legal counsel before signing this Stipulation.
- 4. Respondent agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board (Board). The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Respondent waives all rights to any appeal of the Board's order, if adopted in the form as attached.
- 5. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall then be returned to the Division

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of Legal Services and Compliance for further proceedings. In the event that the Stipulation is not accepted by the Board, the parties agree not to contend that the Board has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.

- 6. The parties to this Stipulation agree that the attorney or other agent for the Division of Legal Services and Compliance and any member of the Board ever assigned as an advisor in this investigation may appear before the Board in open or closed session, without the presence of Respondent, for purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that any member of the Board may have in connection with deliberations on the Stipulation. Additionally, any such advisor may vote on whether the Board should accept this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
- 7. Respondent is informed that should the Board adopt this Stipulation, the Board's Final Decision and Order is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard Department procedure.
- 8. The Division of Legal Services and Compliance joins Respondent in recommending the Board adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
