The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Wisconsin Chiropractic Examining Board (Board). The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent Craig L. Jordan, D.C., (DOB April 17, 1949) is licensed in the state of Wisconsin as a chiropractor, having license number 1341-12, first issued on February 17, 1976. This license expired on December 14, 2018, and has not been renewed. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.08(3), Respondent retains the right to renew upon payment of a fee until December 13, 2023. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department) is 10817 West Lincoln Avenue, West Allis, Wisconsin 53227.

2. Upon information and belief, Respondent's current address is W199 S7875 Sanctuary Court, Muskego, Wisconsin 53150.



3. At all times relevant to this proceeding, Respondent was employed as a chiropractor, located in West Allis, Wisconsin.

4. Patient A saw Respondent for adjustments related to neck and back pain.

5. On October 7, 2018, Patient A arrived at Respondent's office, on a Sunday when the clinic was closed, to have a complimentary massage.

6. Patient A alleges Respondent had inappropriate contact with her during the massage.

7. Respondent denies having inappropriate contact with Patient A.

8. Respondent is not licensed as a massage therapist in the state of Wisconsin.

9. On January 9, 2019, in connection with the allegations, and to avoid a potentially lengthy and costly trial, Respondent accepted a plea agreement and was convicted in Milwaukee County Circuit Court, case number 2019CM000039, of three (3) counts of Disorderly Conduct, a Class B misdemeanor, in violation of Wis. Stat. §947.01(1).

10. In resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Chiropractic Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 446.03, and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Craig L. Jordan, D.C., violated Wis. Admin. Code § Chir 6.02(26), by violating a law, or aiding or abetting the violation of any law substantially related to the practice of chiropractic.

3. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 460.02, a license is required to engage in the practice of massage therapy.

4. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Craig L. Jordan, D.C., violated Wis. Stat. § 460.02, by practicing massage therapy without a license.

5. As a result of the above conduct, Craig L. Jordan, D.C., is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. §§ 446.03(3) and (5).

#### ORDER

1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.

2. The SURRENDER of the right to renew the license and privilege of Craig L. Jordan, D.C., (license no. 1341-12) to practice as a chiropractor in the State of Wisconsin is hereby accepted.

3. Unless and until Respondent is properly licensed to practice massage therapy or bodywork therapy by the Wisconsin Massage Therapy and Bodywork Therapy Affiliated Credentialing Board, Respondent is enjoined and prohibited from the practice of massage therapy or bodywork therapy in the state of Wisconsin. Violation of this special order may result in a forfeiture of up to \$10,000 for each day of violation. See Wis. Stat. § 440.21(4)(a).

4. Respondent shall not petition the Chiropractic Examining Board for reinstatement.

5. Within 120 days from the date of this Order, Respondent shall pay COSTS of this matter in the amount of \$ 713.00.

6. Payment of costs (made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services) shall be sent by Respondent to the Department Monitor at the address below:



STIPULATION  
**ORDER 0006262**

Division of Legal Services and Compliance Case No. 18 CHI 029

Respondent Craig L. Jordan, D.C., and the Division of Legal Services and Compliance,  
Department of Safety and Professional Services stipulate as follows:

1. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation by the Division of Legal Services and Compliance. Respondent consents to the resolution of this investigation by Stipulation.
2. Respondent understands that by signing this Stipulation, Respondent voluntarily and knowingly waives the following rights:
  - the right to a hearing on the allegations against Respondent, at which time the State has the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
  - the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against Respondent;
  - the right to call witnesses on Respondent's behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena;
  - the right to testify on Respondent's own behalf;
  - the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision;
  - the right to petition for rehearing; and
  - all other applicable rights afforded to Respondent under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code, and other provisions of state or federal law.
3. Respondent is aware of Respondent's right to seek legal representation and has been provided an opportunity to obtain legal counsel before signing this Stipulation.
4. Respondent agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Wisconsin Chiropractic Examining Board (Board). The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Respondent waives all rights to any appeal of the Board's order, if adopted in the form as attached.
5. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall then be returned to the Division

of Legal Services and Compliance for further proceedings. In the event that the Stipulation is not accepted by the Board, the parties agree not to contend that the Board has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.

6. The parties to this Stipulation agree that the attorney or other agent for the Division of Legal Services and Compliance and any member of the Board ever assigned as an advisor in this investigation may appear before the Board in open or closed session, without the presence of Respondent, for purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that any member of the Board may have in connection with deliberations on the Stipulation. Additionally, any such advisor may vote on whether the Board should accept this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.

7. Respondent is informed that should the Board adopt this Stipulation, the Board's Final Decision and Order is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard Department procedure.


8. The Division of Legal Services and Compliance joins Respondent in recommending the Board adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
