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Please read this agreement prior to viewing the Decision:

- The Reports of Decisions is designed to contain copies of all orders issued by credentialing authorities within the Department of Safety and Professional Services from November, 1998 to the present. In addition, many but not all orders for the time period between 1977 and November, 1998 are posted. Not all orders issued by a credentialing authority constitute a formal disciplinary action.
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- There may be discrepancies between the online copies and the original document. Original documents should be consulted as the definitive representation of the order's content. Copies of original orders may be obtained by mailing requests to the Department of Safety and Professional Services, PO Box 8935, Madison, WI 53708-8935. The Department charges copying fees. *All requests must cite the case number, the date of the order, and respondent's name* as it appears on the order.
- Reported decisions may have an appeal pending, and discipline may be stayed during the appeal. Information about the current status of a credential issued by the Department of Safety and Professional Services is shown on the Department's Web Site under "License Lookup."

You are hereby notified that you are subject to a forfeiture of **\$1,000.00** in accordance with Wis. Stat. § 101.88 and Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 316.020 for the negligent electrical installation performed at Scenic Bluffs Community Health Center, 238 Front Street, Cashton, Wisconsin. This forfeiture must be paid within 30 days of the date of mailing of this Notice, or a 12% interest penalty will be assessed and/or enforcement action may be taken against you.

The forfeiture of **\$1,000.00** shall be made out to the "Department of Safety and Professional Services." Include in the memo line "19 COM 013" and send to the following address:


You have the right to request a review of the assessment of forfeiture by sending a written request addressed to Administrator, Division of Industry Services at P.O. Box 7302, Madison, WI 53707-7302 which must be received by the Department no later than 30 days from the date of mailing of this Notice (Date of mailing is date listed above signature block on page

two of this document unless otherwise noted by Department). A request for a review of an assessment of forfeiture must include a statement of the specific reasons why you believe the forfeiture and the grounds for its assessment should be overturned. A request will be denied if receive more than 30 days from the date of mailing of this Notice. Upon receipt of any request for review, the Department will follow up with you in writing with regard to your request.

An investigation by the Department found nine electrical code violations at Scenic Bluff that were committed by you and your company. Attached is a Notice of Violations and Orders where the Department identified violations 1-5 and 7-10 as the violations you are responsible for. Individuals performing electrical installations are required to have their electrical installations conform with the Wisconsin Electrical Code. (See Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 316.020 and Wis. Stat. § 101.88(1)). Individuals who fail to comply with the Code shall forfeit to the state not less than \$25 nor more than \$500 for each violation. Each day of violation constitutes a separate offense. (See Wis. Stat. § 101.88(3)).

A forfeiture of \$1,000.00 amounts to \$111.11 per violation and therefore the forfeiture is reasonable as allowed by Wis. Stat. § 101.88(3). For these reasons the forfeiture of \$1,000.00 is assessed in accordance with Wis. Stat. § 101.88(1) and Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 316.020.
