The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Medical Examining Board (Board). The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent Claudia Rodriguez Galvis, M.D. (DOB July 5, 1978), is licensed in the state of Wisconsin to practice medicine and surgery, having license number 64426-20, first issued on July 20, 2015, with registration current through October 31, 2019. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department) is 1768 Business Center Drive, Suite 100, Reston, Virginia 20190.

2. Respondent is also licensed to practice medicine in Florida. Respondent is board certified in psychiatry and neurology by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology and is board certified in addiction medicine by the American Board of Addiction Medicine.

3. On October 23, 2017, the State of Florida Board of Medicine (Florida Board) issued an Administrative Complaint against Respondent related to her care and treatment of a female patient in 2013.

4. At issue was Respondent's medication order of 200 mg of Seroquel. While Respondent's medication order exceeded the recommended 50 mg initial dose of Seroquel, in her medical judgment, Respondent believed that the patient needed more than the initial recommended dose. The patient receiving the medication was suicidal and demonstrating acute psychotic behavior upon admission. Respondent knew that the patient had previously been prescribed and had taken Seroquel, as well as other psychotropic medications such as Risperdal, without any side effects. Given the clinical presentation of the acute psychotic episode, Respondent ordered more than the initial recommended dose of 50 mg. Subsequent to Respondent's medication order of 200 mg of Seroquel, the patient had an episode of syncope where the patient lost consciousness and fell, suffering facial lacerations.

5. On February 22, 2019, the Florida Board issued a Final Order and Settlement Agreement (Florida Order) which issued a letter of concern and required, *inter alia*, that Respondent comply with following:

- a. Payment of costs and a \$2,000.00 fine; and
- b. Successfully complete five hours of continuing medical education in the area of treating psychiatric conditions and five hours of continuing medical education in the area of Risk Management within one year of the date of the Florida Order.

6. In the Florida Board licensing matter, Respondent disputed that the Seroquel was prescribed inappropriately and that the prescription caused the syncope episode. Respondent stipulated to resolution without admitting that her conduct was below minimal competency standards and had retained an expert supportive of her care.

7. Respondent did not report the Florida Order to the Board.

8. In resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Medical Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 448.02(3), and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent Claudia Rodriguez Galvis, M.D., engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined by Wis. Admin. Code § Med 10.03(3)(a) by failing, within 30 days, to report to the board any final adverse action taken against the licensee's authority to practice medicine and surgery by another licensing jurisdiction concerned with the practice of medicine and surgery.

3. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent Claudia Rodriguez Galvis, M.D., engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined by Wis. Admin. Code § Med 10.03(3)(c) by having any credentialing pertaining to the practice of medicine and surgery or any act constituting the practice of medicine and surgery become subject to adverse determination by any agency of this or another state, or by any federal agency or authority.

4. As a result of the above conduct, Claudia Rodriguez Galvis, M.D., is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 448.02(3).

ORDER

1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.

2. Respondent Claudia Rodriguez Galvis, M.D., is REPRIMANDED.

3. Within 90 days from the date of this Order, Claudia Rodriguez Galvis, M.D., shall pay COSTS of this matter in the amount of \$474.00.

4. Payment of costs shall be made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services and sent to the Department Monitor at the address below:

In the event Respondent violates any term of this Order, Respondent's license (no. 64426-20), or Respondent's right to renew her license, may, in the discretion of the Board or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with the terms of the Order. The Board may, in addition and/or in the alternative refer any violation of this Order to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further investigation and action.



STIPULATION

ORDER 0006448

Division of Legal Services and Compliance Case No. 19 MED 100

Respondent Claudia Rodriguez Galvis, M.D., and the Division of Legal Services and Compliance, Department of Safety and Professional Services stipulate as follows:

1. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation by the Division of Legal Services and Compliance. Respondent consents to the resolution of this investigation by Stipulation.

2. Respondent understands that by signing this Stipulation, Respondent voluntarily and knowingly waives the following rights:

- the right to a hearing on the allegations against Respondent, at which time the State has the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
- the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against Respondent;
- the right to call witnesses on Respondent's behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena;
- the right to testify on Respondent's own behalf;
- the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision;
- the right to petition for rehearing; and
- all other applicable rights afforded to Respondent under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code, and other provisions of state or federal law.

3. Respondent is aware of Respondent's right to seek legal representation and has been provided an opportunity to obtain legal counsel before signing this Stipulation. Respondent is represented by Linda V. Meagher.


4. Respondent agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board (Board). The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Respondent waives all rights to any appeal of the Board's order, if adopted in the form as attached.

5. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall then be returned to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further proceedings. In the event that the Stipulation is not accepted by the Board, the parties agree not to contend that the Board has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.

6. The parties to this Stipulation agree that the attorney or other agent for the Division of Legal Services and Compliance and any member of the Board ever assigned as an advisor in this investigation may appear before the Board in open or closed session, without the presence of Respondent or Respondent's attorney, for purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that any member of the Board may have in connection with deliberations on the Stipulation. Additionally, any such advisor may vote on whether the Board should accept this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.


7. Respondent is informed that should the Board adopt this Stipulation, the Board's Final Decision and Order is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard Department procedure.

8. The Division of Legal Services and Compliance joins Respondent in recommending the Board adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.




