FINAL DECISION AND ORDER

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Wisconsin Board of Nursing (Board). The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent Amanda J. Morse, R.N., (DOB XX-XX-1990) is licensed in the state of Wisconsin as a registered nurse, having license number 229473-30, first issued on June 16, 2016, and current through February 28, 2020. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department) is located in Mercer, Wisconsin 54547.

2. At all times relevant to this proceeding, Respondent was employed as a registered nurse at health care center (Center), located in Wisconsin.

3. The Department opened an investigation based on allegations that Respondent had taken a medication not prescribed to her and had diverted medication from her employer.

4. Respondent admits that she took Adderall® that was not prescribed to her on five (5) or less occasions in 2016 and 2017.

5. Respondent states that she took the Adderall® because she was under a great deal of stress due to relationship and financial issues at the time.

6. Respondent states that the last time she took Adderall® was in October of 2017.

7. Respondent denies diverting medication from the Center.

8. The Department's investigation did not reveal any evidence that Respondent diverted medication from the Center or that she was ever suspected of diverting medication from the Center.

9. Respondent's employer did not have any concerns about possible alcohol or other drug abuse (AODA) or impairment issues during the time she worked there.

10. Respondent has never undergone an AODA assessment, nor has she ever been referred for an AODA assessment.

11. On February 28, 2020, Respondent completed 7.6 hours of continuing education on the topics of professional accountability and legal liability, and ethics and professionalism.

12. In resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Board of Nursing has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07, and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. Adderall® is a combination of dextroamphetamine and amphetamine. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 961.16(5)(a), an amphetamine is a schedule II controlled substance for which, under the circumstances at issue, a prescription is required pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 961.38(2).

3. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Amanda J. Morse, R.N., violated Wis. Admin. Code § N 7.03(8)(e), by obtaining, possessing or attempting to obtain or possess a drug without lawful authority.

4. As a result of the above conduct, Amanda J. Morse, R.N., is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07(1g)(b) and (d).

ORDER

1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.

2. Respondent Amanda J. Morse, R.N., is REPRIMANDED.

3. The Board recognizes the aforementioned continuing education courses taken by Respondent and considers that education sufficient to satisfy education the Board would have otherwise required.

4. Within 120 days from the date of this Order, Amanda J. Morse, R.N., shall pay COSTS of this matter in the amount of \$1,363.00.

5. Request for approval of courses, proof of successful course completion and payment of costs (made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services) shall be sent by Respondent to the Department Monitor at the address below:

In the event Respondent violates any term of this Order, Respondent's license (229473-30), or Respondent's right to renew her license, may, in the discretion of the Board or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with the terms of the Order. The Board may, in addition and/or in the alternative refer any violation of this Order to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further investigation and action.

7. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.

STIPULATION

ORDER 0006743

Division of Legal Services and Compliance Case No. 17 NUR 674

Respondent Amanda J. Morse, R.N., and the Division of Legal Services and Compliance, Department of Safety and Professional Services, stipulate as follows:

1. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation by the Division of Legal Services and Compliance. Respondent consents to the resolution of this investigation by Stipulation.

2. Respondent understands that by signing this Stipulation, Respondent voluntarily and knowingly waives the following rights:

- the right to a hearing on the allegations against Respondent, at which time the State has the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
- the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against Respondent;
- the right to call witnesses on Respondent's behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena;
- the right to testify on Respondent's own behalf;
- the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision;
- the right to petition for rehearing; and
- all other applicable rights afforded to Respondent under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code, and other provisions of state or federal law.

3. Respondent is aware of Respondent's right to seek legal representation and has been provided an opportunity to obtain legal counsel before signing this Stipulation. Respondent is represented by Attorney Mario Mendoza.


4. Respondent agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Wisconsin Board of Nursing (Board). The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Respondent waives all rights to any appeal of the Board's order, if adopted in the form as attached.

5. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall then be returned to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further proceedings. In the event that the Stipulation is not accepted by the Board, the parties agree not to contend that the Board has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.

6. The parties to this Stipulation agree that the attorney or other agent for the Division of Legal Services and Compliance and any member of the Board ever assigned as an advisor in this investigation may appear before the Board in open or closed session, without the presence of Respondent or Respondent's attorney, for purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that any member of the Board may have in connection with deliberations on the Stipulation. Additionally, any such advisor may vote on whether the Board should accept this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.

7. Respondent is informed that should the Board adopt this Stipulation, the Board's Final Decision and Order is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard Department procedure.


8. The Division of Legal Services and Compliance joins Respondent in recommending the Board adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
