You are hereby notified that you are subject to a forfeiture of **\$100.00** in accordance with Wis. Stat. § 101.88 because you engaged in electrical wiring work without possessing a proper credential in violation of Wis. Stat. § 101.862. This forfeiture must be paid within 30 days of the date of mailing of this Notice, or a 12% interest penalty will be assessed and/or enforcement action may be taken against you.

The forfeiture of **\$100.00** shall be made out to the “Department of Safety and Professional Services.” Include in the memo line “19 UNL 131” and send to the following address:



You are receiving this forfeiture because you performed electrical wiring work at 1200 North Parker Drive in Janesville WI without possessing a valid electrical license. An investigation was opened and you responded to the Department admitting that you engaged in electrical wiring work at this site. A review of the Department’s credentialing records shows that you do not possess an electrical license. This is a violation of Wis. Stat. § 101.862 and Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 305.40.

Violating rules and statutes adopted by the Department carries with it a forfeiture of no less than \$25.00 nor more than \$500 for each violation as allowed by Wis. Stat. § 101.88.

For these reasons the forfeiture of \$100.00 is assessed in accordance with Wis. Stat. § 101.88.
