The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the resolution of this renewal application. The Wisconsin Board of Nursing (Board) adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On or about October 21, 2020, Scott Woik (Applicant), submitted an application (no. 739023), for a Wisconsin Registered Nurse license via endorsement of his Michigan Registered Nurse credential (no. 47-04-272123).

2. Applicant has the following prior discipline regarding his Michigan Registered Nurse credential:

- A. On or about January 16, 2018, the Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs filed an administrative complaint alleging various violations of the standards of professional conduct. Applicant's failure to respond to the administrative complaint was treated as an admission of the allegations.
- B. On or about May 3, 2018, the Michigan Board of Nursing Disciplinary Subcommittee imposed an indefinite suspension, various conditions to reinstatement, including the completion of an Alcohol and Other Drug

Abuse (AODA) Assessment, entrance into a monitoring agreement, and probation for a period of two (2) years.

- C. On or about September 17, 2020, the Michigan Health Professional Recovery Program (HPRP) sent Applicant a letter noting the HPRP received Applicant's evaluation and reviewed Applicant's case. Based on Applicant's lack of qualifying diagnoses, the HPRP found Applicant did not meet the criteria for monitoring.
- D. On or about November 17, 2020, the Michigan Board of Nursing issued an order granting Applicant's application for reinstatement. Applicant's Michigan credential was placed on probation for at least one (1) year and requires Applicant:
 - i. inform Applicant's nursing employer and supervisor of his Michigan credential orders,
 - ii. obtain one (1) year of nursing employment demonstrating compliance with the minimal standards of acceptable and prevailing nursing practice, and the ability to practice with reasonable skill and safety,
 - iii. ensure Applicant's nursing supervisor file four (4) quarterly reports regarding Applicant's work performance,
 - iv. inform the Michigan Board of Nursing of any changes in employment, and
 - v. be subject to additional disciplinary action for failure to complete any terms of the order.

3. In resolution of this matter, Applicant consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07 and is authorized to enter the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. §§ 15.08(5)(c) and 227.44(5).

2. The Board may deny or limit a license if Applicant committed a violation of Wis. Stat. § 441.07(1g).

3. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Applicant violated Wis. Stat. §§ 441.07(1g)(b) and (d), and Wis. Admin. Code § 7.03(1)(b), by having a license to practice nursing or a nurse licensure compact privilege to practice denied, revoked, suspended, limited, or having the credential holder otherwise disciplined in another state, territory, or country.

4. As a result of the above conduct, Applicant is subject to limitations on his license pursuant to Wis. Stat. §§ 441.07(1g)(b) and (c).

ORDER

1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.
2. Limitations upon Applicant's Registered Nurse credential are necessary to ensure that he is fit and competent to practice as a Registered Nurse.
3. Applicant's ability to practice as a Registered Nurse in the state of Wisconsin, and his privilege to practice pursuant to the Enhanced Nurse Licensure Compact (Compact), is LIMITED for a period of at least one (1) year as follows:
 - A. Applicant shall show a copy of this Order to his current and any future employer. Applicant shall provide the Department of Safety and Professional Services Monitor (Department Monitor) with written acknowledgement from each employer that a copy of this Order has been received. Such acknowledgement shall be provided to the Department Monitor within fourteen (14) days of beginning new employment and/or within fourteen (14) days of the date of this Order for employment current as of the date of this Order.
 - B. It is Applicant's responsibility to arrange for his professional nursing supervisor(s) to provide work reports to the Department Monitor on a quarterly basis, beginning 90 days from the date of this Order. These reports shall describe the Applicant's activities and verify that he is in compliance with the laws governing the practice of minimal standards of acceptable and prevailing nursing practice with reasonable skill and safety.
 - C. Applicant shall report to the Department Monitor any change of employment status, residence, address or telephone number within five (5) days of the date of a change.
 - D. Applicant shall commit no new violations of law and shall report all law enforcement contacts leading to arrest, charge or conviction, including DWI/OWI and municipal/ordinance violations, to the Department Monitor within 48 hours of any such event, including any convictions resulting from pending charges.
 - E. Applicant is responsible for compliance with all of the terms and conditions of this Order, including the timely submission of reports by others. Applicant shall promptly notify the Department Monitor of any suspected violations of any of the terms and conditions of this Order by Applicant.

4. After one (1) year of successful compliance under this Order, including at least six hundred (600) hours of approved nursing practice during one (1) year, the Applicant may petition the Board for full, unrestricted licensure. The Board may grant or deny any petition, in its discretion, or may modify this Order as it sees fit.

5. Pursuant to the Compact, Applicant may not practice in a Compact state, other than Wisconsin, while his license is encumbered by any limitation or restriction imposed by this order.

6. Any requests, petitions, reports and other information required by this Order shall be mailed, e-mailed, faxed or delivered to:

7. In the event Applicant violates any term of this Order, Applicant's license, or Applicant's right to renew his license, may, in the discretion of the Board or its designee, be **SUSPENDED**, without further notice or hearing. The Board or its designee may terminate the suspension if provided with sufficient information that Applicant is in compliance with the Order and that it is appropriate for the suspension to be terminated. Whether to terminate the suspension shall be wholly in the discretion of the Board or its designee. The Board may, in addition and/or in the alternative refer any violation of this Order to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further investigation and action.

8. Applicant shall be responsible for all costs and expenses incurred in conjunction with the monitoring, screening, supervision, and any other expenses associated with compliance with the terms of this Order. Being dropped from a program for non-payment is a violation of this Order.

9. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.


ORDER 0007104

It is stipulated between Applicant and the Wisconsin Board of Nursing (Board) as follows:

1. Applicant filed an application for a Registered Nurse license.
2. Information received by the Board reflects a basis for denial of licensure.
3. Based upon the information of record, the Board agrees to issue, and Applicant agrees to accept, an Order granting a Registered Nurse license, subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the attached Order adopting the Stipulation.
4. Applicant understands that by signing this Stipulation, Applicant voluntarily and knowingly waives the following rights:
 - the right to request a hearing related to the denial of the application;
 - the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against Applicant;
 - the right to call witnesses on Applicant's behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena;
 - the right to testify on Applicant's own behalf;
 - the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision;
 - the right to petition for rehearing; and
 - all other applicable rights afforded to Applicant under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code, and other provisions of state or federal law.
5. Applicant is aware of Applicant's right to seek legal representation and has been provided an opportunity to obtain legal counsel before signing this Stipulation.
6. Applicant agrees to the adoption of the attached Order Granting Limited License by the Board. The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Order Granting Limited License without further notice, appearance, or consent of the parties.
7. Applicant waives all rights to any appeal of the Board's Order, as adopted in the form as attached.

8. Applicant is informed that the Order Granting Limited License is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard procedure.

9. Applicant is informed that the Order Granting Limited License is an encumbrance as defined by the Enhanced Nurse Licensure Compact (Compact) and Applicant's multi-state license and/or privilege, if any, will be subject to all terms and conditions of the Compact.
