

WISCONSIN DEPARTMENT OF SAFETY AND PROFESSIONAL SERVICES



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The Department investigated a complaint that on June 2, 2020 at N550 Gannon Road, Lodi, Wisconsin, the Crystal Lake Campground, a DSPS Electrical Inspector arrived at the location, noticed two electrical service vehicles belonging to Respondent Nakoma Electric and that two employees (Milovets and an unidentified individual) were at the project site installing electrical wiring, which included branch circuits. The Department employee approached Milovets, identified himself as an employee of DSPS, and explained to them that an electrical permit needed to be obtained before they could begin their work. The employee stated that the individuals refused to provide him their licenses and their names. The employee then asked the

individuals to stop working due to them violating state law and Respondents agreed and left the site.

The Department's investigation found that a permit was not obtained until approximately two weeks after the DSPS employee visited the site.

The Department allowed you an opportunity to respond. After reviewing the evidence, including your response, the Department found that the complaint has merit.

IGOR MILOVETS'S REGISTERED ELECTRICIAN ENROLLMENT is suspended for engaging in electrical work without the proper supervision in violation of Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 305.40(4)(d)1 and for engaging in misconduct in violation of Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 305.10(1)(a)5.

Milovets was asked by the Department who was with him when the DSPS employee arrived at the scene. Milovets stated "Mich Childs" in writing. The Department was unable to locate any journeyman or master electrician with a name similar or the same as "Mich Childs." Therefore, Milovets did not have the proper direct supervision of his electrical work as required by Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 305.40(4)(d)1. Milovets engaged in misconduct by providing a false name (or an individual who isn't licensed) in violation of Wis. Admin. Code § SPS. 305.10(1)(a)5.

The Department allowed you an opportunity to respond. After reviewing the evidence, including your response, the Department found that the complaint has merit.

Therefore, based on the foregoing, the Department finds that a total suspension of 28 days is appropriate and is entered pursuant to the terms laid out in this document.

You have the right to request a hearing on the suspension by sending a request for hearing to the Department of Safety and Professional Services, Chief Legal Counsel, P.O. Box 7190, Madison, Wisconsin 53707-7190, which must be received by the Department no later than 30 days from the date of mailing of this Notice. Any hearing on the suspension will be held in accordance with the requirements set forth in Wis. Stat. ch. 227.
