You are hereby notified that your dwelling contractor and dwelling contractor qualifier certificates (DC-101901045, DCQ-120700406) are hereby revoked.

The basis for this revocation is as follows:

You indicated to the Department that you wish to forfeit your credentials.

In addition, the Department finds the following:

Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 305.10(1)(a)3. Revocation for engaging in negligent/incompetent behavior.

The Department received a complaint concerning a contract you entered into with Chris Bloomer to construct a new dwelling at 9263 N Mudhen Lake Drive, Siren, Wisconsin. The Department reviewed the complaint and conducted an investigation to determine its merits.

The Department's investigation found by a preponderance of the evidence that you engaged in negligent/incompetent behavior. The Department spoke with the local inspector who inspected the home and found that the home had numerous building code violations. Failure to build a home to code is evidence of negligence/incompetence.

Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 305.10(1)(a)5. Revocation for engaging in misconduct.

The Department's investigation also found by a preponderance of the evidence that you engaged in "misconduct" as defined by Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 305.003(43). The Department found that you engaged in financial misconduct by failing to properly pay the subcontractors who

worked on the project. The Department found, in total, approximately \$37,000 in funds that were designated for a subcontractor and ultimately never given to said contractor. The Department's investigation found seven (7) subcontractors who did not receive their full payment or payments where you indicated from the construction loan that it would be going to a subcontractor and then you would pay the subcontractor less than what you had indicated.

Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 305.10(1)(a)8 & 14b. Revocation for failure to follow state and local rules.

The investigation found that you started the job prior to obtaining the necessary permit. The Department spoke with the local inspector who indicated that you started the project and poured a slab of concrete prior to obtaining a permit, a violation of local and state rules.

The Department provided you an opportunity to respond and considered your responses, including the fact that you indicated verbally numerous times to the investigator that you were willing to forfeit your credentials. You stated that you were no longer building homes and an internet search of your company found that to be a credible claim.

Based on the foregoing, the Department finds that you engaged in negligence, incompetence, and misconduct. These actions put the public at harm, create public distrust and the Department has authority under Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 305.10(1)(a)3, 5, 8, & 14 to revoke your credentials for this behavior.

You have the right to request a hearing on the revocation by sending a request for hearing to the Department of Safety and Professional Services, Chief Legal Counsel, P.O. Box 7190, Madison, Wisconsin 53707-7190, which must be received by the Department no later than 30 days from the date of mailing of this Notice. The request for a hearing on the revocation shall set out specifically and in full detail every reason why this order is unreasonable, and every issue to be considered by the department on the hearing. Anything not addressed in the request shall be deemed waived. Any hearing on the revocation will be held in accordance with the requirements set forth in Wis. Stat. ch. 227.
