The Notice of Hearing, Petition for Administrative Injunction, and the Prehearing Conference Report and Order, and the Notice of Adjourned Prehearing Conference in this matter, were translated into Chinese (Mandarin) and were served on Respondent by the Department of Safety and Professional Services (SPS) Division of Legal Services and Compliance, on July 9, 2021, by both certified and regular mail, consistent with Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 3.07. No answer was filed. On September 3, 2021, the Notice of Default and Order in this case were issued, which required SPS to serve the Respondent with a translated copy of the Division of Hearings and Appeals' Proposed Order when it is issued.

Because Respondent did not participate in this matter and did not request that future documents be translated, the September 3, 2021 order is AMENDED: SPS is not required to serve the Respondent with a translated copy of the Division of Hearings and Appeals' Proposed Order when it is issued.

#### PROCEDURAL HISTORY

This proceeding was initiated on April 9, 2021, when the Department of Safety and Professional Services, Division of Legal Services and Compliance (Department), filed a Notice of Hearing and Petition for Administrative Injunction against Qiuying Zhao (Respondent) alleging that she provided massage therapy without a license in the state of Wisconsin, in violation of Wis. Stat. § 460.02. Administrative Law Judge Angela Chaput Foy (ALJ) was assigned to the matter.

The Department served Respondent with a copy of the Notice of Hearing and Petition for Administrative Injunction on April 9, 2021, by sending them to her last known address via certified and regular mail, pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 3.07(1). Respondent failed to file an answer within 20 days from the date of service, as required by Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 3.08(4).

Following the expiration of the 20-day period to file an answer, the ALJ scheduled a telephone prehearing conference for May 19, 2021. Notice of this prehearing conference was

mailed to both parties. At the prehearing conference, the ALJ called Respondent, and Respondent answered but was unable to participate due to a language barrier. Respondent referenced an interpreter, but no other communication was understood by the ALJ or the Department's attorney, and Respondent disconnected the call. The ALJ attempted to call Respondent back, but Respondent did not answer, and the ALJ was unable to leave a message.

On June 4, 2021, the ALJ issued a Prehearing Conference Report, which ordered the Department to serve Respondent with copies of the Notice of Hearing, Petition for Administrative Injunction, and the Prehearing Conference Report translated into her native language and Respondent to file an answer within 20 days of service of the translated documents. The Report also scheduled another prehearing conference for July 13, 2021, which was adjourned to August 31, 2021, where the Department would provide an interpreter.

The Department served the translated documents, including the Notice of Adjourned Prehearing Conference, on Respondent by sending a copy to her last known address via certified and regular first-class mail, pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 3.07(1). Respondent failed to file an answer within 20 days from the date of service of the translated documents and failed to appear at the prehearing conference on August 31, 2021.

Based on Respondent's failure to file an answer to the Petition and failure to appear at the prehearing conference, the Department moved for a finding that Respondent was in default pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code §§ SPS 3.13 and HA 1.07(3)(c).

On September 3, 2021, the ALJ issued a Notice of Default against Respondent and ordered the Department to file a recommended Proposed Decision and Order by October 4, 2021.

#### **FINDINGS OF FACT**

# Facts as Alleged in Petition for Administrative Injunction

- 1. Respondent Qiuying Zhao (DOB xx/xx/1977) is not and has never been licensed to practice massage therapy and bodywork therapy in the State of Wisconsin.
- 2. Respondent's last known address is '. Greenfield, Wisconsin 53220.
- 3. On October 31, 2019, Respondent was arrested for prostitution at Asian Massage Therapy in West Allis, Wisconsin, after a police investigation revealed that Respondent offered sexual favors for money to undercover officers during a massage.
- 4. Respondent denied sexual contact with massage clients but admitted to working at Asian Massage Therapy and providing massage therapy services to clients.
- 5. On September 21, 2020, Respondent pled guilty to one count of Prostitution-Sexual Contact, a misdemeanor, in violation of Wis. Stat. § 944.30(1m)(e), in Milwaukee County

Circuit Court Case No. 2019CM003638. The Court withheld entry of judgment of conviction pending Respondent's compliance with a deferred judgment agreement.

## Facts Related to Default

- 6. On April 9, 2021, the Department served Respondent with the Petition for Administrative Injunction and Notice of Hearing by sending a copy to her last known address by both certified and regular mail, pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 3.07(1).
- 7. On April 15, 2021, the signed certified mail receipt was returned to the Department by the U.S. Postal Service indicating the Petition for Administrative Injunction and Notice of Hearing were delivered to Respondent on April 13, 2021.
  - 8. Respondent failed to file an answer to the Petition for Administrative Injunction.
- 9. After the expiration of the 20-day period to file an answer, the ALJ scheduled a telephone prehearing conference for May 19, 2021. The ALJ sent notice of the conference by U.S. mail to both parties. The notice ordered Respondent to contact the ALJ no later than May 18, 2021, to provide a telephone number where she could be reached for the conference.
  - 10. Respondent failed to contact the ALJ by May 18, 2021, with a telephone number.
- 11. At the prehearing conference on May 19, 2021, the Department provided the telephone number it had for Respondent to the ALJ. The ALJ called and Respondent answered, but she was unable to participate due to a language barrier. Respondent referenced an interpreter, but no other communication was understood by the ALJ or the Department's attorney, and Respondent disconnected the call. The ALJ attempted to call Respondent back, but she did not answer and the ALJ was unable to leave a message.
- 12. On June 4, 2021, the ALJ issued a Prehearing Conference Report, Order, and Notice of Adjourned Telephone Prehearing Conference. Based on the exchange that occurred during the May 19, 2021 prehearing conference, the requirements of Wis. Stat. § 885.37¹, and to ensure due process, the ALJ ordered the Department to serve Respondent with copies of the Notice of Hearing, Petition for Administrative Injunction, and the Prehearing Conference Report, Order, and Notice of Adjourned Telephone Prehearing Conference dated June 4, 2021, translated into her native language. The Order also required Respondent to file an answer within 20 days of service and scheduled another prehearing conference for July 13, 2021, where an interpreter

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> "[1]n any administrative contested case proceeding before a state, county or municipal agency, if the agency conducting the proceeding has notice that a party to the proceeding has a language difficulty because of the inability to speak or understand English, has a hearing impairment, is unable to speak or has a speech defect, the agency shall make a factual determination of whether the language difficulty or hearing or speaking impairment is sufficient to prevent the party from communicating with others, reasonably understanding the English testimony or reasonably being understood in English. If the agency determines that an interpreter is necessary, the agency shall advise the party that he or she has a right to a qualified interpreter. After considering the party's ability to pay and the other needs of the party, the agency may provide for an interpreter for the party at the public's expense." Wis. Stat. § 885.37(3)(b).

would be provided by the Department. On June 11, 2021, the ALJ issued an order granting the Department's adjournment request and issued a Notice of Adjourned Prehearing Conference scheduling an adjourned prehearing conference for August 31, 2021.

- 13. On July 9, 2021, the Department served the translated documents, including the June 11, 2021 Order Granting Adjournment Request and Notice of Adjourned Prehearing Conference, on Respondent by sending a copy to her last known address via certified and regular first-class mail, pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 3.07(1).
- 14. On July 14, 2021, the signed certified mail receipt was returned to the Department by the U.S. Postal Service indicating the translated documents were delivered to Respondent on July 12, 2021.
- 15. Respondent failed to file an answer to the translated Petition for Administrative Injunction.
- 16. On August 31, 2021, Respondent failed to appear at the prehearing conference. The Department moved for default based on Respondent's failure to file an answer and failure to appear at the August 31, 2021 prehearing conference, pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code §§ SPS 3.13 and HA 1.07(3)(c).
- 17. On September 3, 2021, the ALJ issued a Notice of Default against Respondent and ordered the Department to file a recommended Proposed Decision and Order by October 4, 2021. The Order required the Department to send a translated copy of the Notice of Default and Order to Respondent.
- 18. The Department timely filed its recommended Proposed Decision and Order with the ALJ and sent the translated documents to Respondent at her last known address by both certified and regular mail.

#### DISCUSSION

## Jurisdictional Authority

The Department has the authority to conduct investigations, hold hearings and make findings as to whether a person has engaged in a practice without a credential required under Chapters 440 to 480 of the Wisconsin Statutes. If the Department determines that a person has engaged in a practice without a credential, the Department may issue a special order enjoining the person from the continuation of the practice. Wis. Stat. §§ 440.21(1) and (2).

Pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 3.09, the undersigned ALJ, an employee of the Department of Administration, Division of Hearings and Appeals, has authority to preside over administrative injunction proceedings in accordance with Wis. Stats. §§ 20.901 and 227.46(1).

# Default

The Division properly served the Petition for Administrative Injunction and Notice of Hearing, including a copy translated into her native language, upon Respondent by mailing copies to her at her last known address. Wis. Stat. § 440.11(2). Service by mail is complete upon mailing. Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 3.07(1). "If the respondent fails to answer as required by s. SPS 3.08 or fails to appear at the hearing at the time fixed therefor, the respondent is in default and the department may make findings and enter an order on the basis of the petition and other evidence." Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 3.13; see also Wis. Admin. Code § HA 1.07(3)(b) ("If a respondent fails to appear, the administrative law judge may...take the allegations in an appeal as true as may be appropriate....").

Respondent violated Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 3.08(4) by failing to file an answer to the Petition for Administrative Injunction within 20 days from the date of service. Respondent also failed to appear and participate in the prehearing telephone conference on August 31, 2021. Therefore, Respondent is in default, and findings and an order may be entered on the basis of the Petition.

# Unlicensed Practice

No person may provide massage therapy or bodywork therapy unless the person is licensed under Chapter 460 of the Wisconsin Statutes. Wis. Stat. § 460.02.

The facts as stated in the Petition for Administrative Injunction are undisputed. Respondent provided massage therapy to clients at Asian Massage Therapy in West Allis, Wisconsin, without a license issued by the Wisconsin Massage Therapy and Bodywork Therapy Affiliated Credentialing Board.

Therefore, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.21(2) and Wis. Admin. Code Ch. SPS 3, a special order enjoining Respondent from continuing to practice massage therapy or bodywork therapy until she is properly licensed in the state of Wisconsin is reasonable and warranted.

## SPECIAL ORDER FOR ADMINISTRATIVE INJUNCTION

For the reasons set forth above, IT IS ORDERED that Respondent Qiuying Zhao is hereby enjoined and prohibited from practicing massage therapy or bodywork therapy in the state of Wisconsin until she is properly licensed by the Wisconsin Massage Therapy and Bodywork Therapy Affiliated Credentialing Board.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that in the event Respondent violates this Special Order, Respondent may be required to forfeit not more than \$10,000 for each offense, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.21(4). Each day of the continued violation constitutes a separate offense. The attorney general or any district attorney may commence an action in the name of the state to recover such forfeiture.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the terms of the Special Order are effective the date it is signed by the Department.
