## Re: UNLICENSED ELECTRICAL WORK

You are hereby notified that you are subject to a forfeiture of **\$500.00** in accordance with Wis. Stat. § 101.88(3) because you engaged in electrical work without possessing the necessary credential in violation of Wis. Stat. § 101.862(2). This forfeiture must be paid within 30 days of the date of mailing of this Notice or enforcement action may be taken against you.

The forfeiture of **\$500.00** shall be made out to the "Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services." Include in the memo line "20 UNL 78" and send to the following address:

You are receiving this forfeiture because a Department investigation found by a preponderance of the evidence that you performed electrical work at Fairview Auto, 8315 State Road 76, Neenah WI 54956 without possessing any electrical license. A license is required in the state of Wisconsin to perform most electrical work, including the work that you performed. The Department spoke with you and you admitted to performing the electrical work.

The basis of the forfeiture amount stems from an inspection the city of Hudson performed on July 28, 2021. That inspection found five electrical code violations, not including the violation of engaging in unlicensed electrical work. The violations are as follows:

Violation: NEC 300.15 - Open splices/no boxes for the lights

Violation: The area where vehicles are being spray painted shall comply with Article 516 of NEC.

Violation: NEC 210.8(B)(8) – No GFCI protection for the receptacles in the area used for servicing vehicles.

Violation: NEC 110.12(A) – Breaker openings in the panel not properly closed.

**Violation:** NEC 400.12(1) – Cord for the sign in front window is hardwired into a box. A flexible cord cannot be used as a permanent wiring method.

The Department utilized discretion under Wis. Stat. § 101.88(3) and enters a forfeiture of \$100.00/violation.

You have the right to request a hearing on this matter by sending a request for hearing to the Department of Safety and Professional Services, Chief Legal Counsel, P.O. Box 7190, Madison, Wisconsin 53707-7190, which must be received by the Department no later than 30 days from the date of mailing of this Notice. Any review will be held in accordance with the requirements set forth in Wis. Stat. § 101.02(6). Such request for review shall set out specifically and in full detail every reason why this order is unreasonable, and every issue to be considered by the Department in the review.
