Re: UNLICENSED ELECTRICAL WORK

You are hereby notified that you are subject to a forfeiture of **\$250.00** in accordance with Wis. Stat. § 101.88(3) because you engaged in electrical work without possessing the necessary credential in violation of Wis. Stat. § 101.862(2). This forfeiture must be paid within 30 days of the date of mailing of this Notice or enforcement action may be taken against you. Further, you shall not be allowed to obtain a dwelling contractor, dwelling contractor qualifier, plumbing, or electrical credential from the Department of Safety and Professional Services until this forfeiture is paid as you violated Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 320.09(2) by failing to properly obtain a permit for the work performed.

The forfeiture of **\$250.00** shall be made out to the "Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services." Include in the memo line "20 COM 99" and send to the following address:

You are receiving this forfeiture because a Department investigation found by a preponderance of the evidence that you performed electrical work at 1222 South 7th Street Prairie Du Chien, WI

53821 without possessing any electrical license. A license is required in the state of Wisconsin to perform most electrical work, including the work that you performed. The Department spoke with you and you admitted to performing the electrical work. You claimed that you were unaware that you were unable to do the electrical work at the site since you owned the property. Statutes require that an individual both own and reside at a property to be exempt from the licensure requirements.

For engaging in electrical work without the proper credential the forfeiture of \$250.00 is assessed in accordance with Wis. Stat. § 101.88(3).

You have the right to request a hearing on this matter by sending a request for hearing to the Department of Safety and Professional Services, Chief Legal Counsel, P.O. Box 7190, Madison, Wisconsin 53707-7190, which must be received by the Department no later than 30 days from the date of mailing of this Notice. Any review will be held in accordance with the requirements set forth in Wis. Stat. § 101.02(6). Such request for review shall set out specifically and in full detail every reason why this order is unreasonable, and every issue to be considered by the Department in the review.
