On February 10, 2022, the Wisconsin Board of Nursing (“Board”) issued a Final Decision and Order (“Order”) limiting Respondent’s professional nursing license with certain terms and conditions including, but not limited to, completion of an assessment by an approved mental health provider experienced in conducting Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse (AODA) assessments. The Order further states that Respondent’s license shall be limited in a manner to address any concerns the Board, or its designee, has with the conduct set out in the Order’s findings of fact and to address any recommendations resulting from the assessment.

On June 24, 2022, the Board Liaison reviewed and accepted the report resulting from Respondent’s AODA assessment. Based on the assessor’s recommendations, the following is entered:

ORDER

1. Respondent’s registered nurse license (license number 238620-30) is further LIMITED as follows:
 - a. Within sixty (60) days of the date of this Order, Respondent shall at her own expense, take and successfully complete the *West Virginia Best Practice Prescribing & Drug Diversion Training* course offered by RN.com AMN Healthcare Education Services for a total of four (4) hours.
 - i. Respondent must take and pass any exam offered for the course.
 - ii. Respondent shall submit proof of successful completion of the education in the form of verification from the institution providing the education to the Department Monitor at the address stated below. None of the education completed pursuant to this requirement may be used to satisfy any continuing education requirements that have been or may be instituted by the Board and may not be used in any future attempt to upgrade a credential.

- b. The Board's monitoring liaison may change the number of credit hours and/or education topics in response to a request from Licensee. The monitoring liaison may consider the topic availability and/or hours of education when determining if a change to the ordered education should occur.
