FINAL DECISION AND ORDER

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Medical Examining Board (Board). The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusion of Law, and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent Isaac Dor, M.D., (Year of Birth 1960) is licensed in the state of Wisconsin to practice medicine and surgery, having license number 42825-20, first issued on November 10, 2000, with registration current through October 31, 2021.¹ Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department) is in Chesterton, Indiana 46304.

¹ Respondent's license was set to expire on November 1, 2021, and it does not appear he has applied for renewal. However, due to 2021 Wisconsin Act 10, all health care provider credentials will not expire until thirty days after the end of the declared national emergency. Therefore, Respondent's license remains active. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.08(3), Respondent retains the right to apply for renewal until October 31, 2026.

2. On April 9, 2020, the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation issued a Consent Order reprimanding Respondent and ordering him to complete ten hours of education on post-operative care and ten hours of education on documentation best practices (IDFPR Order). The IDFPR Order was based on Respondent's failure to properly monitor a patient following a cardiac catheterization procedure.

3. On May 4, 2021, the Florida Board of Medicine issued a Final Order wherein Respondent was issued a Letter of Concern and was ordered to complete education related to Florida laws and rules (FL Order). The FL Order was based on entry of the IDFPR Order.

4. Respondent timely reported the FL Order to the Department on May 12, 2021; however, the Department has no record of Respondent reporting the IDFPR Order.

5. Respondent no longer practices medicine in Wisconsin and has not since 2001.

6. Respondent denies engaging in unprofessional conduct. However, in resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to the entry of the following Conclusion of Law and Order.

CONCLUSION OF LAW

1. The Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 448.02 and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

ORDER

1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.

2. The voluntary SURRENDER by Respondent of his license to practice medicine and surgery in the state of Wisconsin (license number 42825-20), and his right to renew such license, is accepted.

3. In the event Respondent petitions the Board for reinstatement of his license to practice medicine and surgery, the Board may enter an order denying such application or petition without further notice or hearing. Whether to grant a license and whether to impose any limitations or restrictions on any license granted shall be in the sole discretion of the Board, and such decision is not reviewable.

4. In the event Respondent petitions the Board for reinstatement of his license to practice medicine and surgery or applies for another credential in the state of Wisconsin under Wis. Stat. Chs. 440 through 480, Respondent shall pay the costs of this matter in the amount of \$446.00 before any petition or application for a credential will be considered by the applicable Board or Department.

STIPULATION
ORDER 0007854

Division of Legal Services and Compliance Case No. 21 MED 176

Respondent Isaac Dor, M.D., and the Division of Legal Services and Compliance, Department of Safety and Professional Services, stipulate as follows:

1. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation by the Division of Legal Services and Compliance. Respondent consents to the resolution of this investigation by Stipulation.
2. Respondent understands that by signing this Stipulation, Respondent voluntarily and knowingly waives the following rights:
 - the right to a hearing on the allegations against Respondent, at which time the State has the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
 - the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against Respondent;
 - the right to call witnesses on Respondent's behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena;
 - the right to testify on Respondent's own behalf;
 - the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision;
 - the right to petition for rehearing; and
 - all other applicable rights afforded to Respondent under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code, and other provisions of state or federal law.
3. Respondent is aware of Respondent's right to seek legal representation and has been provided an opportunity to obtain legal counsel before signing this Stipulation. Respondent is represented by Attorney Peyton B. Engel.
4. Respondent agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board (Board). The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Respondent waives all rights to any appeal of the Board's order, if adopted in the form as attached.

5. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall then be returned to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further proceedings. In the event that the Stipulation is not accepted by the Board, the parties agree not to contend that the Board has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.

6. The parties to this Stipulation agree that the attorney or other agent for the Division of Legal Services and Compliance and any member of the Board ever assigned as an advisor in this investigation may appear before the Board in open or closed session, without the presence of Respondent, for purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that any member of the Board may have in connection with deliberations on the Stipulation. Additionally, any such advisor may vote on whether the Board should accept this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.

7. Respondent is informed that should the Board adopt this Stipulation, the Board's Final Decision and Order is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard Department procedure.


8. The Division of Legal Services and Compliance joins Respondent in recommending the Board adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
