The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the resolution of this application. The Professional Counselor Section of the Wisconsin Marriage and Family Therapy, Professional Counseling, and Social Work Examining Board (Section) adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Sarah N. Reiser (Applicant) resides in Wisconsin.

2. On or about February 16, 2018, Applicant was granted a Wisconsin Licensed Professional Counselor Training License (PC-TL) credential (no. 3834-226), which expired on February 16, 2022.

- A. Applicant's PC-TL credential was limited under certain terms and conditions in Order 7341, dated April 20, 2021.
- B. Order 7341 found Applicant has the following incidents of practicing while impaired due to the utilization of alcohol:

- i. On September 20, 2019, a Clinic supervisor found Applicant asleep on the floor in Applicant's office with the alarm on Applicant's phone going off. The supervisor woke Applicant, and Applicant admitted that she uses alcohol to help her sleep and is aware that she has a problem. Applicant left work and did not interact with any clients on that day. As a result of this incident, Applicant agreed to a corrective plan of action which included self-reporting as an impaired professional to the Department.
- On October 1, 2019, Applicant applied for the Professional Assistance Program (PAP) through the Department. Applicant reported that she took two (2) prescribed anti-anxiety pills at work on September 20, 2019, fell asleep at her desk, and that her anxiety had worsened due to alcohol use.
- iii. On October 24, 2019, while working at the Clinic, Applicant consumed alcohol in her vehicle during her lunch break. After a coworker reported that Applicant appeared to be under the influence, Applicant was taken to a hospital for a drug screen. Applicant completed a breath test, with initial results of a .354 Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC). Fifteen minutes later, a second test resulted in .336 BAC.
- iv. On October 25, 2019, Applicant resigned from her position at the Clinic.
- v. On November 12, 2019, Applicant informed the Department that she no longer worked for the employer that referred her to PAP and withdrew her PAP application.
- C. Order 7341 found that Applicant engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined by Wis. Admin. Code § MPSW 20.02(9), by practicing or attempting to practice while the credential holder is impaired due to the utilization of alcohol or other drugs, or as a result of an illness which impairs the credential holder's ability to appropriately carry out the functions delineated under the credential in a manner consistent with the safety of a client, patient, or the public.
- D. Order 7341 limited Applicant's PC-TL credential to certain terms and conditions for a period of at least five (5) years from the date of the Order, April 20, 2021.

3. On February 28, 2020, Applicant was convicted of Operating w/ PAC ≥ 0.15 , 1st, and Driving the Wrong Way on a Divided Highway, both ordinance violations.

A. According to the police report, at approximately 8:00 p.m., police were dispatched due to reports of a vehicle driving the wrong way down a highway. Applicant drove the wrong way down an exit ramp and was pulled over. Applicant did not know she was driving the wrong way and stated she was coming from work. While speaking with Applicant police observed a strong odor of intoxicants and her eyes were glossy. Applicant denied consuming alcohol. Applicant failed the Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and blew a Preliminary Breath Test (PBT) of .264. The report stated Applicant did not know the prohibited alcohol concentration in Wisconsin; police informed her it was .08. When police showed Applicant her PBT reading, police asked her what it was and Applicant replied, "not good."

- B. Applicant paid a fine, had an Interlock Ignition Device (IID) for twelve (12) months, her driver's license was revoked for nine (9) months, and she completed an AODA assessment. Applicant's WAID assessment noted Applicant's BAC at .330 but found irresponsible use of alcohol.
- C. Although Applicant was working with the Section regarding limitations to her PC-TL credential due to impairment issues, Applicant did not report her Operating w/ PAC ≥ 0.15 violation to the Section.

4. On May 26, 2021, Applicant recognized that she had a problem with alcohol and entered residential rehabilitation. Applicant states she successfully completed intensive outpatient therapy on November 10, 2021. Applicant's diagnoses at her admission to treatment were Alcohol Use Disorder-Severe, and Stimulant (amphetamine) use Disorder – In Remission.

5. On or about October 6, 2021, Applicant filed an application (no. 782116) for a Wisconsin Licensed Professional Counselor credential.

6. As of April 21, 2022, the Department Monitor reports Applicant has been complaint with the Order #7341, including compliance with her drug testing and obtaining an approved treater. Applicant has not yet demonstrated full compliance of five (5) consecutive years of successful compliance under Order 7341.

7. In resolution of this matter, Applicant consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Section has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 457.26(2) and is authorized to enter the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. §§ 15.08(5)(c) and 227.44(5).

2. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 457.26(2)(h), the Section may deny or limit a license if Applicant violated this chapter, or any rule promulgated under this chapter.

3. Pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code § MPSW 20.02(9), practicing or attempting to practice while the credential holder is impaired due to the utilization of alcohol or other drugs, or as a result of an illness which impairs the credential holder's ability to appropriately carry out the

functions delineated under the credential in a manner consistent with the safety of a client, patient, or the public, is unprofessional conduct.

4. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Applicant engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined by Wis. Admin. Code § MPSW 20.02(9), by practicing or attempting to practice while the credential holder is impaired due to the utilization of alcohol or other drugs, or as a result of an illness which impairs the credential holder's ability to appropriately carry out the functions delineated under the credential in a manner consistent with the safety of a client, patient, or the public.

5. As a result of the above conduct, Applicant is subject to limitations on her license pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 457.26(2)(h).

<u>ORDER</u>

1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.

2. Limitations upon Applicant's Licensed Professional Counselor credential are necessary to ensure that she is fit and competent to practice as a professional counselor.

3. Applicant's ability to practice as a Licensed Professional Counselor in the state of Wisconsin is LIMITED as follows:

- A. For a period of at least five (5) years from the date of this Order, Applicant shall comply with the following Work Requirements:
 - i. Applicant shall provide Applicant's professional counseling employer with a copy of this Order before engaging in, or continuing to engage in, any professional counseling employment. Applicant shall provide the Department of Safety and Professional Services Monitor (Department Monitor) with written acknowledgment from each employer that a copy of this Order has been received. Such acknowledgment shall be provided to the Department Monitor within fourteen (14) days of beginning new employment and/or within fourteen (14) days of the date of this Order for employment current as of the date of this Order.
 - ii. Applicant shall practice only in a work setting pre-approved by the Section or its designee. Work setting pre-approval shall be obtained by contacting the Department Monitor.
 - iii. Applicant's professional counseling supervisor shall provide quarterly work reports to the Department Monitor or its designee.

- iv. Applicant shall report to the Section any change of employment status, residence, address or telephone number within five (5) days of the date of change.
- B. For a period of at least five (5) years from the date of this Order, Applicant shall comply with the following Drug and Alcohol Monitoring Program requirements:
 - i. Applicant shall continue to be enrolled in and participate in a drug and alcohol monitoring program which is approved by the Department (Approved Program).
 - ii. At the time Applicant enrolls in the Approved Program, Applicant shall review the rules and procedures made available by the Approved Program. Failure to comply with all requirements for participation in drug and alcohol monitoring established by the Approved Program is a substantial violation of this Order. The requirements shall include:
 - 1. Contact with the Approved Program as directed on a daily basis, including vacations, weekends and holidays.
 - 2. Production of a urine, blood, sweat, fingernail, hair, saliva or other specimen at a collection site designated by the Approved Program within five (5) hours of notification of a test.
 - 3. The Approved Program shall require the testing of specimens at a frequency of not less than forty-nine (49) times per year, for at least the first year of this Order. Thereafter, the Section may adjust the frequency of testing on its own initiative at any time.
 - iii. Applicant shall abstain from all personal use of alcohol.
 - iv. Applicant shall abstain from all personal use of controlled substances as defined in Wis. Stat. § 961.01(4), except when prescribed, dispensed or administered by a practitioner for a legitimate medical condition. Applicant shall disclose Applicant's drug and alcohol history and the existence and nature of this Order to the practitioner prior to the practitioner ordering the controlled substance. Applicant shall at the time the controlled substance is ordered immediately sign a release in compliance with state and federal laws authorizing the practitioner to discuss Applicant's treatment with, and provide copies of treatment records to, the Section or its designee. Copies of these releases shall immediately be filed with the Department of Safety and Professional Services Monitor (Department Monitor).

- v. Applicant shall report to the Department Monitor all prescription medications and drugs taken by Applicant. Reports must be received within twenty-four (24) hours of ingestion or administration of the medication or drug, and shall identify the person or persons who prescribed, dispensed, administered or ordered said medications or drugs. Each time the prescription is filled or refilled, Applicant shall immediately arrange for the prescriber or pharmacy to fax and mail copies of all prescriptions to the Department Monitor.
- vi. Applicant shall provide the Department Monitor with a list of over-thecounter medications and drugs that he may take from time to time. Overthe-counter medications and drugs that mask the consumption of controlled substances or of alcohol, create false positive screening results, or interfere with Applicant's treatment and rehabilitation, shall not be taken unless ordered by a physician, in which case the drug must be reported as described in the paragraph 3.B,v.
- vii. All positive test results are presumed valid and may result in automatic suspension of licensure by the Section or the Section's designee. Applicant must prove by a preponderance of the evidence an error in collection, testing, fault in the chain of custody or other valid defense.
- viii. If any urine, blood, sweat, fingernail, hair, saliva or other specimen is positive or suspected positive for any controlled substances or alcohol, Applicant shall promptly submit to additional tests or examinations as the Section or its designee shall determine to be appropriate to clarify or confirm the positive or suspected positive test results.
- C. For a period of at least five (5) years from the date of this Order, Applicant shall comply with the following Drug and Alcohol Treatment Requirements:
 - i. Applicant shall enter in and continue therapy by a therapist approved by Section or its designee, at a frequency set by the treater.
 - ii. The therapist shall submit quarterly reports to the Department Monitor.
 - iii. Applicant shall attend Alcoholics Anonymous meetings, Narcotics Anonymous meetings, or other Section-approved equivalent program for recovering professionals, at a frequency set by the treater, but not less than two (2) times per week. Applicant shall provide proof of attendance on a quarterly basis to the Department Monitor.
 - iv. Within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order, Applicant shall complete and submit to the Department Monitor, a relapse prevention plan which shall address, but is not limited to, the following items:

- a. Describe your attitude about sobriety and what will help you sustain your motivation/commitment to sobriety;
- b. Identify your goals;
- c. What motivates you;
- d. What consequences are likely if you relapse;
- e. Identify your triggers and/or warning signs, and your specific plan to avoid drinking or using;
- f. Who will you contact for support and assistance;
- g. Emergency planning; what you will do if you encounter a crisis or a stressful situation that triggers a strong urge to use or drink;
- h. Changing your routine is important in staying sober; how will you begin and end each day in a way that supports sobriety and recovery;
- i. Do you foresee any obstacles/barrier to implementing this plan? What will you do about these roadblocks?
- j. How will you remain accountable?
- v. Applicant shall submit self-reports to the Department Monitor on a quarterly basis, as directed by the Department Monitor. The reports shall include a summary of Respondent's compliance with the terms and conditions of the Order in the previous quarter and provide an update on Applicant's relapse prevention plan follow through.
- D. For a period of at least five (5) years from the date of this Order, Applicant shall commit no new violations of law and shall report all law enforcement contacts leading to arrest, charge or conviction, including DWI/OWI and municipal/ordinance violations, to the Department Monitor within forty-eight (48) hours of any such event, including any convictions resulting from pending charges.

4. Applicant may petition the Section on an annual basis for modification of the terms of this Order, however no such petition for modification shall occur earlier than one (1) year from the date of Order 7341 (April 20, 2021). Any petition for modification shall be accompanied by a written recommendation from Applicant's Treater expressly supporting the specific modifications sought. Denial of a petition in whole or in part shall not be considered a denial of a license within the meaning of Wis. Stat. § 227.01(3)(a), and Applicant shall not have a right to request any further hearings or proceedings on the denial.

5. After two (2) consecutive years of successful compliance under this Order, together with compliance with Order 7341, including at least six hundred (600) hours of approved professional counseling practice each year, the Applicant may petition the Section for return of full licensure. The Section may grant or deny any petition, in its discretion, or may modify this Order as it sees fit.

6. Any requests, petitions, reports and other information required by this Order shall be mailed, e-mailed, faxed or delivered to:

7. In the event Applicant violates any term of this Order, Applicant's license, or Applicant's right to renew her license, may, in the discretion of the Section or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing. The Section or its designee may terminate the suspension if provided with sufficient information that Applicant is in compliance with the Order and that it is appropriate for the suspension to be terminated. Whether to terminate the suspension shall be wholly in the discretion of the Section or its designee. The Section may, in addition and/or in the alternative refer any violation of this Order to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further investigation and action.

8. Applicant shall be responsible for all costs and expenses incurred in conjunction with the monitoring, screening, supervision, and any other expenses associated with compliance with the terms of this Order. Being dropped from a program for non-payment is a violation of this Order.

9. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.

2. At all times relevant to this proceeding, Respondent was employed as an outpatient therapist at a clinic (Clinic) located in Shawano, Wisconsin.

3. On September 20, 2019, a Clinic supervisor found Respondent asleep on the floor in Respondent's office with the alarm on Respondent's phone going off. The supervisor woke Respondent, and Respondent admitted that she uses alcohol to help her sleep and is aware that she has a problem. Respondent left work and did not interact with any clients on that day. As a result of this incident, Respondent agreed to a corrective plan of action which included self-reporting as an impaired professional to the Department.

4. On October 1, 2019, Respondent applied for the Professional Assistance Program (PAP) through the Department. Respondent reported that she took two prescribed anti-anxiety pills at work on September 20, 2019, fell asleep at her desk, and that her anxiety had worsened due to alcohol use.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Professional Counselor Section of the Wisconsin Marriage and Family Therapy, Professional Counseling, and Social Work Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 457.26(2), and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined by Wis. Admin. Code § MPSW 20.02(9), by practicing or attempting to practice while the credential holder is impaired due to the utilization of alcohol or other drugs, or as a result of an illness which impairs the credential holder's ability to appropriately carry out the functions delineated under the credential in a manner consistent with the safety of a client, patient, or the public.

3. As a result of the above violations, Respondent is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. 457.26(2)(f).

ORDER

- 1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.
- 2. Respondent is REPRIMANDED.

3. The license to practice professional counseling in-training in the state of Wisconsin issued to Respondent (license number 3834-226) is LIMITED as follows:

- a. For a period of at least five (5) years from the date of this Order:
 - i. Respondent shall enroll and participate in a drug and alcohol monitoring program which is approved by the Department (Approved Program). Enrollment shall occur within thirty (30) calendar days from the date of this Order.
 - ii. At the time Respondent enrolls in the Approved Program, Respondent shall review all of the rules and procedures made available by the Approved Program. Failure to comply with all requirements for participation in drug and alcohol monitoring established by the Approved Program is a substantial violation of this Order. The requirements shall include:
 - 1. Contact with the Approved Program as directed on a daily basis, including vacations, weekends, and holidays.
 - 2. Production of a urine, blood, sweat, fingernail, hair, saliva or other specimen at a collection site designated by the Approved Program within five (5) hours of notification of a test.
 - 3. The Approved Program shall require the testing of specimens at a frequency of not less than forty-nine (49) times per year, for at least the first year of this Order. Thereafter, the Board may adjust the frequency of testing on its own initiative at any time.
 - iii. Respondent shall abstain from all personal use of alcohol.
 - iv.
- Respondent shall abstain from all personal use of controlled substances as defined in Wis. Stat. § 961.01(4), except when prescribed, dispensed, or administered by a practitioner for a legitimate medical condition. Respondent shall disclose Respondent's drug and alcohol history and the existence and nature of this Order to the practitioner prior to the practitioner ordering the controlled substance. Respondent shall at the time the controlled substance is ordered immediately sign a release in compliance with state and federal laws authorizing the practitioner to discuss

Respondent's treatment with, and provide copies of treatment records to, the Board or its designee. Copies of these releases shall immediately be filed with the Department Monitor.

- v. Respondent shall report to the Department Monitor all prescription medications and drugs taken by Respondent. Reports must be received within 24 hours of ingestion or administration of the medication or drug, and shall identify the person or persons who prescribed, dispensed, administered or ordered said medications or drugs. Each time the prescription is filled or refilled, Respondent shall immediately arrange for the prescriber or pharmacy to fax and mail copies of all prescriptions to the Department Monitor.
- vi. Respondent shall provide the Department Monitor with a list of over-the-counter medications and drugs that she may take from time to time. Over-the-counter medications and drugs that mask the consumption of controlled substances or of alcohol, create false positive screening results, or interfere with Respondent's treatment and rehabilitation, shall not be taken unless ordered by a physician, in which case the drug must be reported as described in the paragraph 3(a)v.
- vii. All positive test results are presumed valid and may result in automatic suspension of licensure by the Board or the Board's designee. Respondent must prove by a preponderance of the evidence an error in collection, testing, fault in the chain of custody or other valid defense.
- viii. If any urine, blood, sweat, fingernail, hair, saliva, or other specimen is positive or suspected positive for any controlled substances or alcohol, Respondent shall promptly submit to additional tests or examinations as the Board or its designee shall determine to be appropriate to clarify or confirm the positive or suspected positive test results.
- ix. Respondent shall practice only in a work setting pre-approved by the Section or its designee.
- x. Respondent shall provide her professional counseling employer with a copy of this Order before engaging in any professional counseling employment. Respondent shall provide the Department Monitor with written acknowledgment from each professional counseling employer that a copy of this Order has been received. Such acknowledgment shall be provided to the Department Monitor within fourteen (14) days of beginning new employment and/or within fourteen (14) days of the date of this Order for employment current as of the date of this Order.

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4. The Section or its designee may, without hearing, suspend Respondent's license upon receipt of information that Respondent is in substantial or repeated violation of any provision of this Order. A substantial violation includes, but is not limited to, a positive drug screen. A repeated violation is defined as the multiple violations of the same provision or violation of more than one provision. The Section or its designee may, in conjunction with the suspension, prohibit Respondent from seeking termination of the suspension for a specified period of time.

5. The Section or its designee may terminate the suspension if provided with sufficient information that Respondent is in compliance with the Order and that it is appropriate for the suspension to be terminated. Whether to terminate the suspension shall be wholly in the discretion of the Section or its designee.

6. After the first year from the date of this Order, Respondent may petition the Section on an annual basis for a modification of the terms of this Order. After five (5) consecutive years of successful compliance, the Respondent may petition the Section for return of full licensure. The Section may grant or deny any petition, in its discretion, or may modify this Order as it sees fit.

7. Within 120 days from the date of this Order, Respondent shall pay COSTS of this matter in the amount of \$1,200.00.

8. Any requests, documents, and payment of costs (made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services) shall be sent by Respondent to the Department Monitor at the address below:

The Section may, in addition and/or in the alternative, refer any violation of this Order to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further investigation and action.

1. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation by the Division of Legal Services and Compliance. Respondent consents to the resolution of this investigation by Stipulation.

2. Respondent understands that by signing this Stipulation, Respondent voluntarily and knowingly waives the following rights:

- the right to a hearing on the allegations against Respondent, at which time the State has the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
- the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against Respondent;
- the right to call witnesses on Respondent's behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena;
- the right to testify on Respondent's own behalf;
- the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision;
- the right to petition for rehearing; and
- all other applicable rights afforded to Respondent under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code, and other provisions of state or federal law.

3. Respondent is aware of Respondent's right to seek legal representation and has been provided an opportunity to obtain legal counsel before signing this Stipulation.

4. Respondent agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Professional Counselor Section of the Marriage and Family Therapy, Professional Counseling, and Social Work Examining Board (Section). The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Respondent waives all rights to any appeal of the Section's order, if adopted in the form as attached. 5. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Section, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall then be returned to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further proceedings. In the event that the Stipulation is not accepted by the Section, the parties agree not to contend that the Section has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.

6. The parties to this Stipulation agree that the attorney or other agent for the Division of Legal Services and Compliance and any member of the Section ever assigned as an advisor in this investigation may appear before the Section in open or closed session, without the presence of Respondent, for purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that any member of the Section may have in connection with deliberations on the Stipulation. Additionally, any such advisor may vote on whether the Section should accept this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.

7. Respondent is informed that should the Section adopt this Stipulation, the Section's Final Decision and Order is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard Department procedure.

8. The Division of Legal Services and Compliance joins Respondent in recommending the Section adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
