The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department). The Department has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Department in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Respondent Academy of Beauty Professionals is licensed by the State of Wisconsin as a school of cosmetology, having license number 185-87, first issued on April 28, 2021 and current through March 31, 2023.
- 2. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department) is in Green Bay, Wisconsin 54303.
- 3. On August 24, 2021, the Department conducted an inspection of Respondent. The inspection revealed the following issues:

- a. The tile floor portion of the school contained hair, hair clippings and other debris away from workstations that were actively being used. The wooden floor portion of the school was pitted and appeared dirty.
- b. Various cleaners and disinfectants were scattered throughout the school. Not all cleaners and disinfectants were located at workstations or in locations that could be locked/marked as not for the public.
- c. Other surfaces in the establishment appeared stained/dirty such as some of the silver carts, the shelf behind the hair washing basins, the sink, and the wall behind the sink. A vent in the room by the entrance of the establishment was very dusty.
- d. Instruments in the public area of the establishment used for mixing and applying hair coloring were not in a covered container. An emery board and palates used for pedicures were left uncovered. A palate with lotion was left uncovered by one of the pedicure bowls. Hair curlers were left uncovered. Curling irons and other heated hair instruments were left uncovered. Clean bowls for mixing hair coloring, clips, combs, and brushes were left uncovered by the sink. An emery board and a nail brush at the front of the establishment appeared clean but were left sitting on a counter.
- e. The washing machine by the cubby was running with a container of laundry detergent pods nearby. The pods did not contain bleach, and no bleach was obvious.
- 4. On September 20, 2021, the Department emailed Respondent and asked them to address the issues revealed in the inspection.
- 5. On October 4, 2021, Respondent emailed the Department photos showing that the sanitary issues revealed in the inspection had been addressed.
- 6. In resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.64, and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).
- 2. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent violated Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 62.11(1)(g) by violating Wis. Stat. Ch. 440, subch. V, or Wis. Stat. Ch. 454 in the operation of a school or specialty school or establishment associated with a school or specialty school.
- 3. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent violated Wis. Admin. Code § Cos 3.01(4) by failing to keep all floor coverings in an establishment in a clean, orderly and safe condition, and failing to regularly remove loose hair and place it in a closed container.

- 4. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent violated Wis. Admin. Code § Cos 3.01(6) by failing to provide safe and secure areas for storing cleaning and disinfecting equipment, and failing to store poisonous substances in public areas in a locked cabinet or closet.
- 5. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent violated Wis. Admin. Code § Cos 4.01(1) by failing to maintain all areas of an establishment in accordance with the applicable standards, and failing to maintain the equipment, tools, and implements used by licensees in a clean, sanitary, and safe condition.
- 6. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent violated Wis. Admin. Code § Cos 4.01(5) by failing to drain shampoo bowls and basins after each use and keep them in a sanitary and safe condition.
- 7. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent violated Wis. Admin. Code § Cos 4.02(4) by failing to place clean and disinfected contact equipment in covered containers, and failing to provide separate containers for the immediate storage of soiled contact equipment until cleaned and disinfected.
- 8. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent violated Wis. Admin. Code § Cos 4.02(6) by failing to disinfect laundry with a solution containing a germicidal compound.
- 9. As a result of the above violations, Respondent is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.64(3)(b)3.
- 10. As a result of the above violations, Respondent is subject to a forfeiture pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.64(3)(c).

ORDER

- 1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.
- 2. Within fourteen (14) days from the date of this Order, Respondent Academy of Beauty Professionals shall pay a FORFEITURE in the amount of \$600.00.
- 3. Payment of forfeiture (made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services) shall be sent by Respondent to the Department Monitor at the address below:

In the event Respondent violates any term of this Order, Respondent's license (number 185-87), or Respondent's right to renew its license, may, in the discretion of the Department or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with the terms of the Order. The Department may, in addition and/or in the alternative, refer any violation of this Order to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further investigation and action.
 - 5. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.

Respondent Academy of Beauty Professionals and the Division of Legal Services and Compliance, Department of Safety and Professional Services stipulate as follows:

- This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation by the Division of Legal Services and Compliance. Respondent consents to the resolution of this investigation by Stipulation.
- Respondent understands that by signing this Stipulation, Respondent voluntarily and knowingly waives the following rights:
 - the right to a hearing on the allegations against Respondent, at which time the State has the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
 - the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against Respondent;
 - the right to call witnesses on Respondent's behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena;
 - the right to testify on Respondent's own behalf;
 - the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision;
 - the right to petition for rehearing; and
 - all other applicable rights afforded to Respondent under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code, and other provisions of state or federal law.
- Respondent is aware of Respondent's right to seek legal representation and has been provided an opportunity to obtain legal counsel before signing this Stipulation. Respondent is represented by Attorney John F. Mayer.
- Respondent agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department). The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Respondent waives all rights to any appeal of the Department's order, if adopted in the form as attached.
- If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Department, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall then be returned to the

Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further proceedings. In the event that the Stipulation is not accepted by the Department, the parties agree not to contend that the Department has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.

- 6. The parties to this Stipulation agree that the attorney or other agent for the Division of Legal Services and Compliance and any member of the Department ever assigned as an advisor in this investigation may appear before the Department in open or closed session, without the presence of Respondent, for purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that any member of the Department may have in connection with deliberations on the Stipulation. Additionally, any such advisor may vote on whether the Department should accept this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
- 7. Respondent is informed that should the Department adopt this Stipulation, the Department's Final Decision and Order is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard Department procedure.
- 8. The Division of Legal Services and Compliance joins Respondent in recommending the Department adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
