to July 22, 2022. The work performed at these sites would require a licensed electrician to perform the work and for supervision to be done by a licensed master or journeyman electrician.² None of the electrical work done was exempted under Wis. Stat. § 101.862(4). Every project performed as an agent of Sun Badger Solar is a violation of Wis. Stat. § 101.862(2) and subject to forfeitures as allowed by Wis. Stat. § 101.88(3).

Further, the investigation found that you performed electrical work at 1216 East Roberta Avenue, Waukesha. You held yourself out as an electrician, only performed some of the work you were hired to perform, and failed to finish the job without providing any refund. The Department received a copy of a check made out to you for \$2,700. This is a violation of Wis. Stat. § 101.862(2) and you are subject to forfeitures as allowed by Wis. Stat. § 101.88(3).


The Department afforded you an opportunity to respond. The Department reviewed your response and found that you admitted to providing supervision to the employees doing the installations for Sun Badger Solar and admitted to installing wiring on at least two occasions.

The Department has considered all of the evidence gathered and finds by a preponderance of evidence that you violated Wis. Stat. § 101.862.

The Department has the authority to enter a forfeiture of no less than \$25 nor greater than \$500 for each violation of Wisconsin statute or code. *See* Wis. Stat. § 101.88(3). The Department finds approximately 100 instances of violations of Wis. Stat. § 101.862. A forfeiture of \$10,000 is approximately \$100 per violation and thus an appropriate forfeiture as set forth by statute.

You have the right to request a hearing on this matter by sending a request for hearing to the Department of Safety and Professional Services, Chief Legal Counsel, P.O. Box 7190, Madison, Wisconsin 53707-7190, which must be received by the Department no later than 30 days from the date of mailing of this Notice. Any review will be held in accordance with the requirements set forth in Wis. Stat. § 101.02(6). Such request for review shall set out specifically and in full detail every reason why this order is unreasonable, and every issue to be considered by the Department in the review.
