NOTICE OF FORFEITURE

You are hereby notified that you are subject to a forfeiture of **\$400.00** in accordance with Wis. Stat. § 145.12(4) for failing to install plumbing in accordance with the plumbing code rules adopted by the State of Wisconsin through Wis. Stat. § 145.02(2)(a). This forfeiture shall be paid within 30 days of the date of mailing of this Notice. Further, you shall not be allowed to renew your credentials from the Department of Safety and Professional Services until this forfeiture is paid.

The forfeiture of **\$400.00** shall be made out to the "Department of Safety and Professional Services." Include in the memo line "21 COM 32" and send to the following address:


You are receiving this forfeiture because a department investigation found that you improperly installed plumbing at Gooch's Bar & Grill in Boulder Junction, Wisconsin. The Department's investigation found that you did not follow the plumbing plans and swapped two lines that ended up causing the water/refuse to go to the wrongly assigned tanks. You then admitted an updated as-built plan did not get timely submitted on this project.

Based on the evidence presented to the Department, there is a preponderance of evidence that you violated the Wisconsin Plumbing Code. Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 382.20(8) requires that all revisions to state approved plans be submitted to the Department for approval. The greasy waste from the kitchen was connected to the POWTS sewage tanks outside the building and the

building sewage was connected to the grease holding tanks. This is a violation of Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 382.34(5).

For these violations the Department has the authority to issue a forfeiture as these are rules stemming from the Department's authority under Wis. Stat. § 145.02(2)(a). The Department is authorized to issue a forfeiture to any person violating Wis. Chapter 145 no less than \$10 and no more than \$1,000. For this reason a forfeiture of \$400.00 is assessed in accordance with Wis. Stat. § 145.12(4).
