The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Wisconsin Massage Therapy and Bodywork Therapy Affiliated Credentialing Board (Board). The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Gregory J. Dickert, L.M.T. (Respondent), (Year of Birth 1959) is licensed in the state of Wisconsin as a massage therapist or bodywork therapist, having license number 11625-146, first issued on January 3, 2012, and current through February 28, 2023.
- 2. At all times relevant to this matter, Respondent was the owner of a massage therapy business that was located in Green Bay, Wisconsin.

- 3. Respondent applied for renewal of his license to practice as a massage therapist in February 2021. Respondent's application for renewal was not approved and as such, his license expired effective March 1, 2021.
- 4. In November 2021, the Board issued Order No. 0007701 to Respondent which reprimanded Respondent and placed him under restrictions. The Order was in response to Respondent's conviction for OWI-4th, in violation of Wis. Stat. § 346.63(1)(a), as well as unlicensed practice as a massage therapist in 2021.
- 5. Respondent began complying with Order No. 0007701 and resumed practice as a massage therapist as Respondent erroneously believed that his renewal application was approved.
- 6. Respondent committed unlicensed practice as a massage therapist on occasions between December 2021 and November 2022, believing that his license was renewed and active.
- 7. On January 10, 2023, the Board credentialing liaison approved renewal of Respondent's license to practice massage therapy.
- 8. Respondent is aware that he must apply for renewal of his license again in February 2023, and that it is his responsibility to ensure that he has a valid, current license before practicing massage therapy.
- 9. In resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 460.14, and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).
- 2. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined by Wis. Stat. § 460.02 by providing massage therapy or bodywork therapy to patients and designating himself as a massage therapist or bodywork therapist or masseuse, or using or assuming the title "massage therapist," "bodywork therapist," or "masseuse," or using any other title or designation that represents or may tend to represent that he is licensed under this chapter, without a valid license.
- 3. As a result of the above conduct, Respondent is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 460.14(2)(g) and (j).

ORDER

- 1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.
- 2. Respondent is REPRIMANDED.

¹ The renewal application was not approved as Respondent had not provided all documents necessary to act on his renewal application.

- 3. Respondent is required to comply with all terms and conditions contained in Board Order No. 0007701. A violation of Board Order No. 0007701 is a violation of this Order.
- 4. Within 120 days from the date of this Order, Respondent shall pay COSTS of this matter in the amount of \$653.00.
- 5. Any requests, petitions, payments of costs (made payable to Department of Safety and Professional Services), and other information required by this Order shall be submitted to:

- 6. In the event Respondent violates any term of this Order, Respondent's license (number 11625-146), or Respondent's right to renew his license, may, in the discretion of the Board or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing. The Board or its designee may terminate the suspension if provided with sufficient information that Respondent is in compliance with the Order and that it is appropriate for the suspension to be terminated. Whether to terminate the suspension shall be wholly in the discretion of the Board or its designee. The Board may, in addition and/or in the alternative refer any violation of this Order to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further investigation and action.
 - 7. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.

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STIPULATION

Gregory J. Dickert, L.M.T. (Respondent) and the Division of Legal Services and Compliance, Department of Safety and Professional Services, stipulate as follows:

- 1. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation by the Division of Legal Services and Compliance. Respondent consents to the resolution of this investigation by Stipulation.
- 2. Respondent understands that by signing this Stipulation, Respondent voluntarily and knowingly waives the following rights:
 - the right to a hearing on the allegations against Respondent, at which time the State has the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
 - the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against Respondent;
 - the right to call witnesses on Respondent's behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena;
 - the right to testify on Respondent's own behalf;
 - the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision;
 - the right to petition for rehearing; and
 - all other applicable rights afforded to Respondent under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code, and other provisions of state or federal law.
- 3. Respondent is aware of Respondent's right to seek legal representation and has been provided an opportunity to obtain legal counsel before signing this Stipulation.
- 4. Respondent agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Wisconsin Massage Therapy and Bodywork Therapy Affiliated Credentialing Board (Board). The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Respondent waives all rights to any appeal of the Board's order, if adopted in the form as attached.

- 5. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall then be returned to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further proceedings. In the event that the Stipulation is not accepted by the Board, the parties agree not to contend that the Board has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.
- 6. The parties to this Stipulation agree that the attorney or other agent for the Division of Legal Services and Compliance and any member of the Board ever assigned as an advisor in this investigation may appear before the Board in open or closed session, without the presence of Respondent, for purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that any member of the Board may have in connection with deliberations on the Stipulation. Additionally, any such advisor may vote on whether the Board should accept this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
- 7. Respondent is informed that should the Board adopt this Stipulation, the Board's Final Decision and Order is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard Department procedure.
- 8. Respondent is further informed that should the Board adopt this Stipulation, the Board's Final Decision and Order will be reported as required by the National Practitioner Databank (NPDB) Guidebook and as otherwise required by any licensure compact or any other state or federal law.

9. The Division of Legal Services and Compliance joins Respondent in recommending the Board adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
