The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Pharmacy Examining Board (Board). The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Mary M. Stieber, R.Ph. (Respondent), (Year of Birth 1963) is licensed in the state of Wisconsin to practice pharmacy, having license number 13826-40, first issued on December 30, 2002, and active through May 31, 2024. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department) is in Green Bay, Wisconsin 54313.

2. On September 17, 2010, Respondent was convicted in Wood County Circuit Court Case Number 2010CT000332, of Operating with PAC .08 or More (3rd), a class U misdemeanor, in violation of Wis. Stat. § 346.63(1)(b).

3. On August 16, 2016, Respondent was convicted in Wood County Circuit Court Case Number 2016CT000180, of Reckless Driving-Endanger Safety, an ordinance violation of Wis. Stat. § 346.62(2).

4. On July 16, 2021, Respondent was convicted in Wood County Circuit Court Case Number 2021CF000128, of Operating with PAC (4th), a class H felony, in violation of Wis. Stat. § 346.63(1)(b). A Judgment of Conviction was entered on July 21, 2021.

5. Respondent was sentenced to 6 months of jail time with Huber work privileges. She was ordered to serve 2 years of probation, abide by DOT lifetime license revocation and lifetime ignition interlock required, maintain absolute sobriety, and undergo an AODA evaluation and comply with AODA recommendations.

6. During Respondent's court-ordered AODA evaluation and treatment, she was diagnosed with Alcohol Use Disorder – Severe.

7. When Respondent applied for renewal of her pharmacy license in May 2018, she did not report the ordinance violation described in paragraph 3, even though she was asked to report ordinance violations that occurred since her last renewal.

8. When Respondent applied for renewal of her pharmacy license in May 2022, she reported the 2021 felony conviction described in paragraph 4. Respondent did not report the 2021 felony conviction to the Department prior to May 2022.

9. In resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 450.10(1) and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

<u>ORDER</u>

1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.

2. The SURRENDER by Respondent of her license to practice pharmacy in the state of Wisconsin (license no. 13826-40), as well as her right to renew such license, is accepted.

3. In the event Respondent petitions the Board for reinstatement of her license to practice pharmacy in the state of Wisconsin or applies for another credential in the state of Wisconsin under Wis. Stat. chs. 440 through 480, Respondent shall pay the costs of this matter in the amount of \$1024, before any petition or application for a credential will be considered by the applicable board or Department.

4. In the event Respondent petitions the Board for reinstatement of her license to practice pharmacy in the state of Wisconsin, the Board may enter an order denying such application without further notice or hearing. Whether to grant a license and whether to impose any limitations

or restrictions on any license granted shall be in the sole discretion of the Board and such decision is not reviewable.

5. Any requests, petitions, payments of costs (made payable to Department of Safety and Professional Services), and other information required by this Order shall be submitted to:

Mary M. Stieber, R.Ph. (Respondent), and the Division of Legal Services and Compliance, Department of Safety and Professional Services, stipulate as follows:

1. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation by the Division of Legal Services and Compliance. Respondent consents to the resolution of this investigation by Stipulation.

2. Respondent understands that by signing this Stipulation, Respondent voluntarily and knowingly waives the following rights:

- the right to a hearing on the allegations against Respondent, at which time the State has the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
- the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against Respondent;
- the right to call witnesses on Respondent's behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena;
- the right to testify on Respondent's own behalf;
- the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision;
- the right to petition for rehearing; and
- all other applicable rights afforded to Respondent under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code, and other provisions of state or federal law.

3. Respondent is aware of Respondent's right to seek legal representation and has been provided an opportunity to obtain legal counsel before signing this Stipulation.

4. Respondent agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board (Board). The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Respondent waives all rights to any appeal of the Board's order, if adopted in the form as attached.

5. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall then be returned to the Division

of Legal Services and Compliance for further proceedings. In the event that the Stipulation is not accepted by the Board, the parties agree not to contend that the Board has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.

6. The parties to this Stipulation agree that the attorney or other agent for the Division of Legal Services and Compliance and any member of the Board ever assigned as an advisor in this investigation may appear before the Board in open or closed session, without the presence of Respondent, for purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that any member of the Board may have in connection with deliberations on the Stipulation. Additionally, any such advisor may vote on whether the Board should accept this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.

7. Respondent is informed that should the Board adopt this Stipulation, the Board's Final Decision and Order is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard Department procedure.

8. Respondent is further informed that should the Board adopt this Stipulation, the Board's Final Decision and Order will be reported as required by the National Practitioner Databank (NPDB) Guidebook and as otherwise required by any licensure compact or any other state or federal law.

9. The Division of Legal Services and Compliance joins Respondent in recommending the Board adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
