The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board of Nursing (Board). The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent Jennifer L. Vosen, R.N., (Year of Birth 1976) is licensed in the state of Wisconsin as a registered nurse with multistate privileges pursuant to the Nurse Licensure Compact (Compact), having license number 132820-30, first issued on July 30, 1999, and current through February 29, 2024. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department) is in Reedsburg, Wisconsin 53959.

¹ Respondent is also licensed in the state of Wisconsin as a nursing home administrator, having license number 3891-65, first issued on September 7, 2016, and current through June 30, 2024.

- 2. At all times relevant to this proceeding, Respondent was employed as a nursing home administrator at a county healthcare center in Reedsburg, Wisconsin (Center).
- 3. On October 6, 2021, the Center began an investigation into allegations raised by a former Center employee against Respondent.
- 4. The Center's investigation found sufficient evidence that Respondent violated Center policies by coming to work under the influence of alcohol and failing to take appropriate remedial action after accidentally sending a nude picture of herself to a subordinate employee while intoxicated.
- 5. After a Center resident tested positive for COVID-19, Respondent called a Center employee and told the employee she did not need to come into work. Respondent was slurring her words during the conversation. Respondent drove in to work and was noted to have trouble standing without support. Respondent admitted to having one or two glasses of wine before coming to work but stated she was not too intoxicated to drive. Respondent also admitted to drinking excessively at work conferences and fundraising events.
- 6. Respondent admitted that she sent a picture of her breasts to a Center supervisor's cell phone. When the supervisor discussed it with her, Respondent said "Oh you know how it is when you have too many glasses of wine." Respondent reported she had most likely been drinking when she sent the photo and did not mean to send it.
- 7. On November 8, 2021, Respondent resigned her employment at the Center after she was informed that her termination was recommended pending a just cause hearing.
- 8. In resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07 and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).
- 2. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent violated or aided and abetted a violation of any law substantially related to the practice of nursing, within the meaning of Wis. Admin. Code § N 7.03(2). Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 111.36(1), employment discrimination because of sex includes, but is not limited to, any of the following actions by any employer...or other person: (b) Engaging in sexual harassment.
- 3. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent is unable to practice safely by reason of alcohol or other substance use, within the meaning of Wis. Admin. Code § N 7.03(6)(f).
- 4. As a result of the above conduct, Respondent is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07(1g)(b), (c), and (d), and Wis. Admin. Code § N 7.03.

ORDER

- 1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.
- 2. Respondent is REPRIMANDED.
- 3. Respondent's license to practice as a registered nurse in the state of Wisconsin (license number 132820-30), and privilege to practice in Wisconsin pursuant to the Compact, are LIMITED as follows:
 - a. Respondent shall fully and satisfactorily comply with all terms and conditions of the Final Decision and Order issued by the Nursing Home Administrators Examining Board in Case No. 21 NHA 066 (NHA Order), which is attached and incorporated herein.
 - b. None of the education completed pursuant to the NHA Order may be used to satisfy any continuing education requirements that have been or may be instituted by the Board or Department, and also may not be used in future attempts to upgrade a credential in Wisconsin.
 - c. In the event the evaluator who conducts the alcohol and other drug abuse (AODA) assessment required in the NHA Order makes recommendations, issues results, or otherwise expresses concerns regarding Respondent's dependence on alcohol or other drugs that may affect public safety, the Board may impose additional limitations upon Respondent's nursing license in order to address those concerns in its discretion. The possible limitations include, but are not limited to:
 - i. AODA treatment and/or attendance at Alcoholics Anonymous meetings
 - ii. AODA monitoring
 - iii. Abstaining from all personal use of alcohol
 - iv. Additional professional education in any identified areas of deficiency
 - v. Restrictions on the nature of nursing practice, practice setting, or requirements for supervision of practice by an approved professional, with periodic reports to the Board or its designee
 - d. This limitation shall be removed from Respondent's license after satisfying the Board or its designee that (1) Respondent has successfully completed all terms and conditions of the NHA Order and the Nursing Home Administrators Examining Board has granted an unrestricted license to practice as a nursing home administrator, and (2) Respondent has fully complied with any additional limitations upon her nursing license issued by the Board.

- 4. Within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, Respondent shall pay COSTS of this matter in the amount of \$349.00.
- 5. Any requests, petitions, payments of costs (made payable to Department of Safety and Professional Services), and other information required by this Order shall be submitted to:

- 6. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.51(5)(b), Respondent's multistate licensure privilege to practice in all Compact states besides Wisconsin is deactivated during the pendency of this Order.
- 7. In the event Respondent violates any term of this Order, Respondent's license (number 132820-30), or Respondent's right to renew her license, may, in the discretion of the Board or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with the terms of the Order. The Board may, in addition and/or in the alternative refer any violation of this Order to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further investigation and action.
 - 8. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Nursing Home Administrators Examining Board (Board). The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent Jennifer L. Vosen, N.H.A., (Year of Birth 1976) is licensed in the state of Wisconsin as a nursing home administrator, having license number 3891-65, first issued on September 7, 2016 and current through June 30, 2024. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department) is in Reedsburg, Wisconsin 53959.

- 2. At all times relevant to this proceeding, Respondent was employed as a nursing home administrator at a county healthcare center in Reedsburg, Wisconsin (Center).
- 3. On October 6, 2021, the Center began an investigation into allegations raised by a former Center employee against Respondent.
- 4. The Center's investigation found sufficient evidence that Respondent violated Center policies by coming to work under the influence of alcohol and failing to take appropriate remedial action after accidentally sending a nude picture of herself to a subordinate employee while intoxicated.
- 5. After a Center resident tested positive for COVID-19, Respondent called a Center employee and told the employee she did not need to come into work. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 456.10 and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).
- 2. Based on the Findings of Fact, Respondent engaged in unprofessional conduct pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code § NHA 5.02(1) by violating in a negligent manner, by an act or acts of omission or commission, or aiding or abetting the violation of any law substantially relating to the practice of nursing home administration. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 111.36(1), employment discrimination because of sex includes, but is not limited to, any of the following actions by any employer...or other person: (b) Engaging in sexual harassment.
- 3. Based on the Findings of Fact, Respondent engaged in unprofessional conduct pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code § NHA 5.02(3) by practicing while impaired by physical, mental or emotional disorder or drug or alcohol use.
- 4. As a result of the above conduct, Respondent is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 456.10(1)(b), and Wis. Admin. Code § NHA 5.

ORDER

- 1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.
- 2. Respondent is REPRIMANDED. .
- 3. Respondent's license to practice as a nursing home administrator in the state of Wisconsin (license number 3891-65) is LIMITED as follows:
 - a. Within ninety (90) days of the date of this Order, Respondent shall, at her own expense, successfully complete four (4) hours of education on the topic of professional boundaries offered by a provider pre-approved by the Board monitoring liaison, including taking and passing any exam offered for the courses.
 - i. Respondent shall submit proof of successful completion of the education in the form of verification from the institution providing the education to the Department Monitor at the address stated below.
 - ii. None of the education completed pursuant to this requirement may be used to satisfy any continuing education requirements that have been or may be instituted by the Board or Department, and also may not be used in future attempts to upgrade a credential in Wisconsin.
 - iii. The Board monitoring liaison may change the number of credit hours and/or education topics in response to a request from Respondent. The monitoring liaison may consider the topic availability and/or hours of education when determining if a change to the ordered education should occur.
 - iv. This limitation shall be removed from Respondent's license after satisfying the Board or its designee that Respondent has successfully completed all the ordered education.
 - b. Within sixty (60) days of the date of this Order, Respondent shall, at her own expense, undergo an alcohol and other drug abuse (AODA) assessment with an evaluator pre-approved by the Board or its designee who has experience conducting such assessments.
 - i. Prior to the assessment, Respondent shall provide a copy of this Order to the evaluator. Respondent shall provide the Department Monitor with written acknowledgment from the evaluator that a copy of this Order has been received by the evaluator. Such acknowledgment shall be provided to the Department Monitor prior to the assessment.
 - ii. Respondent shall provide and keep on file with the evaluator current releases complying with state and federal laws. The releases shall allow the Board, its designee, and any employee of the Department to obtain a copy of the assessment. Copies of these releases shall immediately be filed with the Department Monitor.

- iii. Respondent shall identify and provide the evaluator with authorizations to communicate with all physicians, mental health professionals, and facilities at which Respondent has been treated or evaluated.
- iv. The Board, or its designee, may impose additional limitations upon Respondent's license based on the results of the assessment and/or the evaluator's recommendations, including but not limited to:
 - AODA treatment and/or attendance at Alcoholics Anonymous meetings
 - AODA monitoring
 - Abstaining from all personal use of alcohol
 - Additional professional education in any identified areas of deficiency
 - Restrictions on the nature or setting of practice, or requirements for an approved professional mentor, with periodic reports to the Board or its designee
- v. Respondent shall comply with the evaluator's recommendations.
- 4. Within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, Respondent shall pay COSTS of this matter in the amount of \$1,275.00.
- 5. Any requests, petitions, payments of costs (made payable to Department of Safety and Professional Services), and other information required by this Order shall be submitted to:
