The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Cosmetology Examining Board (Board). The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Respondent Gloria M. Casper (Birth Year 1948) is licensed by the State of Wisconsin as a cosmetologist, having license number 76200-82, first issued on September 3, 1996 and current through March 31, 2025. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department) is in Madison, Wisconsin 53717.
- 2. On May 25, 2022, the Department received a complaint alleging that Complainant received a second-degree chemical burn from a hair service performed by Respondent. The Division of Legal Services and Compliance (DLSC) subsequently opened Case Number 22 BAC 029 for investigation.
- 3. According to the complaint, Complainant visited the salon on April 24, 2022 to receive a perm. Respondent applied a perm solution to Complainant's head and set a timer for twenty minutes. After approximately fifteen minutes, Complainant began experiencing

discomfort, which Respondent addressed by applying cold water and Vaseline. Shortly afterwards, Complainant visited a doctor, who found that Complainant had received second-degree burns from the treatment. Complainant was given a tetanus shot and was prescribed a week's worth of heavy cortisone.

- 4. On June 3, 2022, Respondent's employer provided the Department with Respondent's written statement regarding the incident, dated May 27, 2022. Respondent's statement provided additional context for the incident, but confirmed the basic details.
- 5. On January 4, 2023, the Department contacted Respondent and asked if she performed a skin test prior to beginning the service.
- 6. On January 5, 2023, Respondent stated that she did not perform a skin patch test prior to service because Complainant told her it wasn't necessary.
- 7. In resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Cosmetology Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 454.15(2), and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).
- 2. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent violated Wis. Admin. Code § Cos 2.03(1) by failing to perform services in a manner that is consistent with basic and accepted practice standards.
- 3. As a result of the above violations, Respondent is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 454.15(2)(c) and (i).

ORDER

- 1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.
- 2. Respondent Gloria M. Casper is REPRIMANDED.
- 3. Within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, Respondent shall pay one-third of the COSTS of this matter in the amount of \$703. If costs are not paid within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, interest shall accrue at the statutory rate of 12%, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.22(2).
- 4. All submissions, including payment of costs (made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services) shall be sent by Respondent to the Department Monitor at the address below:



STIPULATION

GLORIA M. CASPER, RESPONDENT. JRDER 0008947

Division of Legal Services and Compliance Case No. 22 BAC 029

Respondent Gloria M. Casper and the Division of Legal Services and Compliance, Department of Safety and Professional Services stipulate as follows:

- 1. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation by the Division of Legal Services and Compliance. Respondent consents to the resolution of this investigation by Stipulation.
- 2. Respondent understands that by signing this Stipulation, Respondent voluntarily and knowingly waives the following rights:
 - the right to a hearing on the allegations against Respondent, at which time the State has the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
 - the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against Respondent;
 - the right to call witnesses on Respondent's behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena;
 - the right to testify on Respondent's own behalf;
 - the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision;
 - the right to petition for rehearing; and
 - all other applicable rights afforded to Respondent under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code, and other provisions of state or federal law.
- 3. Respondent is aware of Respondent's right to seek legal representation and has been provided an opportunity to obtain legal counsel before signing this Stipulation.
- 4. Respondent agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Cosmetology Examining Board (Board). The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Respondent waives all rights to any appeal of the Board's order, if adopted in the form as attached.
- 5. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall then be returned to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further proceedings. In the event that the Stipulation is

not accepted by the Board, the parties agree not to contend that the Board has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.

- 6. The parties to this Stipulation agree that the attorney or other agent for the Division of Legal Services and Compliance and any member of the Board ever assigned as an advisor in this investigation may appear before the Board in open or closed session, without the presence of Respondent, for purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that any member of the Board may have in connection with deliberations on the Stipulation. Additionally, any such advisor may vote on whether the Board should accept this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
- 7. Respondent is informed that should the Board adopt this Stipulation, the Board's Final Decision and Order is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard Department procedure.
