

CLASS OBJECTIVES - Each student will learn to:

- Operate an excavator, compact excavator, dozer, backhoe, front end loader, motor grader, dump truck, log truck loader, and compact truck loader.
- Practice safety procedures including use of personal safety equipment and safety inspection of equipment, including the walkaround inspection.
- Learn the Excavation Competent Person Training standards and proper handling of an OSHA inspection and receive Excavation Competent Person Training Program (ECPT) Certification by participating in a 1-day training program which is included in the 4-week class.
- Use laser and regular transits and various leveling devices.

- Complete routine maintenance for each type of heavy equipment.
- Conduct field staking, benchmarking, offset staking and squaring.
- Learn how to load, unload, and properly secure an over-width excavator on a lowboy trailer meeting DOT regulations.
- Learn how to dig trenches, basements, ponds, culvert installation, grading roads, and much much more!






