- 7. It is my responsibility to fully read all the content of School catalog provided to me. I understand that my signature on this document is acknowledgement of receipt of the catalog and my clear understanding of all of its contents.

- 8. The Heavy Equipment Operation Course tuition including applicable fees is \$5,990.00. The fees for the course are detailed in the school catalog. Tuition that is due from students must be paid by Wednesday of the first week of class (obtain invoice from office). Any tuition being provided by an approved funding source (i.e. Michigan Works, GI Bill®, employer funding, etc.) will be exempt from this requirement. The school accepts credit card, money order, check, electronic funds transfer, or cash.


